

First Fijian Police Chief in US retires



First-ever Fijian Police chief in America officially ends his 30-year career. San Pablo's Police Chief Ron Raman who has led the department since 2017 announced his retirement from the service last month. The city of San Pablo swore in Raman as its ninth chief of police on 30 August six years ago. He implemented the best recruitment strategy (in San Pablo), resulting in being fully staffed for his 92-member department.

lives throughout his work in the department, and his ability to foster relationships with the community has made a lasting difference in the city. Part of Raman's successes in San Pablo, according to the city's proclamation, is that he, with the help of his team, was able to reduce violent crime by 29 per cent and Part I crime by 23 per cent. Part I crimes include homicide, rape, robbery, aggravated assault, burglary, larceny theft, grand theft auto and arson.

Chief Raman impacted many

He previously served as a Captain for Pittsburg Police, where he worked for 21 years. His career started in 1993 with the Concord Police Department as a Community Service Officer. Raman is living the legacy of his grandfather before him. His grandfather, the late Parmesh Uma Raman was a Commissioner of Police in Fiji. "Being a Police Chief for the last six years has really been the highlight of my career. Being in law enforcement is a calling for me," he

said. "It's embedded in my blood. My grandfather was a Commissioner of Police in the Fiji Islands; he was the first Indian-born Commissioner of Police in the Fiji Islands." "Unfortunately, he passed away right before I became the Chief of Police here, so he never got to see that happen, so I'm sure he knows about it now."

Meanwhile City Manager Matt Rodriguez has appointed Capt. Brian Bubar to take over as interim chief upon Raman's

departure. "I know that our city and Police Department will be in good hands during this transition," Raman said. "Thank you to the community and the city for entrusting me with the opportunity to lead this amazing Police Department that will continue to be a model for others in law enforcement." Rodriguez said Raman "has exemplified tremendous leadership during an unprecedented period of growth and innovation in our Police Department."

Planes collide and catch fire at Japan's busy Haneda airport, killing 5. Hundreds evacuated safely



TOKYO — A fiery collision Tuesday between a Japan Airlines passenger jet and a coast guard plane at Tokyo's Haneda Airport killed five coast guard crew members, but all 367 passengers and 12 crew of the commercial jet escaped shortly before it became engulfed, officials said.

The pilot of the coast guard aircraft MA722 was in critical condition, according to the Tokyo Metropolitan Police Department. Fourteen people on the commercial aircraft were injured, Tokyo's fire department said.

Video footage published by Reuters shows the passenger jet, an Airbus A350, moving along the runway before coming to a standstill, in flames. Rescuers can be seen extinguishing the fire.

The flight was arriving in Tokyo from Sapporo, in Japan's northernmost prefecture, Hokkaido, a popular tourist destination.

The passenger jet had just touched down when it "crashed directly into" the coast guard plane, Shigenori Hiraoka, head of Japan's Civil Aviation Bureau, said at a news conference Tuesday evening. "We still need to confirm the details of the interaction with air traffic control concerning the cause of the accident," he said. JAL managing executive officer Noriyuki Aoki told reporters at a news conference that the flight had received permission to land but that exchanges between the cockpit and flight control were under investigation.

Airline officials think the pilot may not have spotted the coast guard plane and therefore did not report abnormalities or problems before landing, but the matter is under investigation, Aoki said. The passenger plane landed at 5:46 p.m., and all 379 aboard were evacuated by 6:05 p.m., Aoki said.

At 5:55 p.m., the coast guard pilot reported to the base that there was an explosion on the runway. The pilot was able to escape the aircraft but was unsure about the other crew members on board, coast guard officials said in a news briefing. The pilot suffered severe burns, police said.

Tsubasa Sawada, a 28-yearold passenger, told Reuters that he heard an explosion about 10 minutes after he and the other passengers evacuated the plane. "I can only say it was a miracle; we could have died if we were late," he said. The coast guard plane was heading to Niigata Airport in western Japan to bring aid to communities devastated by a powerful earthquake that struck the area Monday, according to Japan's Ministry of Land, Infrastructure, Transport and Tourism.

The 7.6-magnitude earthquake in Ishikawa killed at least 48 people and left scores more injured or missing, causing widespread damage and sparking a tsunami warning Monday.

All departing flights from Haneda Airport — closer to Tokyo and busier than the city's other major airport, Narita — were suspended for the rest of the evening. The departure area was filled with travelers waiting to reschedule flights, with long lines at restaurants and waiting areas.

Japanese Prime Minister Fumio Kishida said in a statement posted on social media that he was grateful for the work of first responders and offered his condolences for the five coast guard crew members who were killed, thanking them for their "strong sense of mission and responsibility."

Airbus said in a statement that it was dispatching a team of specialists to assist in the investigation.

Tesla recalls over 1.6 million vehicles in China to fix automatic steering, door latch glitches

BEIJING — Tesla is recalling more than 1.6 million Model S, X, 3 and Y electric vehicles exported to China for problems with their automatic assisted steering and door latch controls.

China's State Administration for Market Regulation announced the recall on Friday. It said Tesla Motors in Beijing and Shanghai would use remote upgrades to fix the problems, so in most cases car owners would not need to visit Tesla service centers.

The recall due to problems with the automatic steering assist function applies to 1.6 million imported Tesla Model S, Model X, Model 3 and Model Ys. When the automatic steering function is engaged, drivers might misuse the combined driving function, increasing a risk of accidents, the notice said. The recall to fix the door unlock logic control for imported Model S and Model X EVs affects 7,538 vehicles made between Oct. 26, 2022 and Nov. 16, 2023. It is needed to prevent door latches from coming open during a collision.

The recalls follow a recall in the U.S. last month of more than 2 million of Tesla EVs to improve its system for monitoring drivers. The recall followed a two-year investigation by the U.S. National Highway Traffic Safety Administration that found the system was defective. into a series of crashes that happened while the Autopilot partially automated driving system was in use. Some were deadly.

The upgrades are intended to get drivers who use Tesla's Autopilot system to pay closer attention to the road. Documents filed by Tesla to the U.S. government said the online software change will increase warnings and alerts to drivers to keep their hands on the steering wheel.

However, research conducted by NHTSA, the National Transportation Safety Board and other investigators show that merely measuring torque on the steering wheel doesn't ensure that drivers are paying sufficient attention.

China is a major market and manufacturing center for Tes-



la, and the company's CEO, Elon Musk, has built close ties with Chinese officials even as U.S.-China relations soured. The company built an electric vehicle plant in Shanghai in 2019 that assembles cars for China, Europe and other overseas markets.

Tesla is the No. 2 seller in the booming Chinese market for electric vehicles. The market leader is Chinese auto company BYD.

Ministry of Women, Children and Social Protection looking into forming partnership with Pacific Polytech



After a meeting this week, Minister for Women, Children & Social Protection, Lynda Tabuya says they are looking into forming a partnership with Pacific Polytech. Tabuya says the objective of the meeting was to lay the foundation for a partnership between Pacific Polytech and the Ministry with specific focus on four key areas. These areas are creating employment opportunities for social welfare recipients with the aim of graduating individuals from welfare to workfare.

She says they spoke about the

placement of students in State owned Golden Age Homes to support the care and support provided for its elderly residents.

The Minister says they also talked about the possibility of the Ministry and Polytech Pacific working together at the Nadogo Technical College which is currently under construction.

She says they wanted to encourage gender mainstreaming in technical trades.

Pacific Poly Tech Chairperson Dr. Ganesh Chand says the four key areas were geared towards creating employment and breaking barriers by supporting women in securing work in male dominated fields.

Dr. Chand further went on to thank the Minister for taking the stand in graduating people from welfare to sustainable livelihood and also advocating for equal employment opportunity for all women.

The Minister thanked the team from Pacific Polytech for reaching out and creating discussions on possible areas which the ministry can work with Pacific Polytech to better the lives of the Ministry's beneficiaries.

Tabuya says the visit was timely, as she is working towards creating pathways for welfare recipients to graduate off the welfare support system.

She adds that welfare assistance is meant to support families for a certain period, and it is very important that they take steps to change the mindset of people and help them break away from the vicious cycle of poverty.

Ministry has commenced work on the minimum wage rate review – Singh

Minister for Employment Agni Deo Singh says the Ministry has commenced work on the review of the minimum wage rates, and there are systems and processes involved and structures in place to facilitate this important work.

Responding to comments raised by the Unity Fiji Party Leader, Savenaca Narube and the Fiji Labour Party Leader, Mahendra Chaudhry in the media, Singh says since the coalition government took office, the work to review the National Minimum Wage and the ten sectoral wage regulations has been part of their commitment from day one.

He says they have constituted the Employment Relations Advisory Board (ERAB) in its proper form at the beginning of the year and facilitated the labour law review to restore the provision of the ERA 2007 to reinstate workers' rights.

He adds this has been completed and is currently being vetted by the Office of the Solicitor General.



The Minister says the Government is now in the process of reinstating the 10 Wages Councils which were removed by the FijiFirst Government as these councils are subcommittees of the ERAB and will determine the sectoral minimum wages.

Singh says the work on the minimum wage review is now in progress, and the ERAB will

determine this with the assistance of a professional consultant in close consultation with the Ministry of Finance.

He says as part of governance, wider consultations will be done with stakeholders nationwide on the review.

Singh adds the Ministry has been reporting on the progress

in all the above work carried out through Parliamentary proceedings and the media.

He says the two-party leaders have either not been following parliamentary proceedings, as well as, the media statements by the Ministry, or they are deliberately pretending to be ignorant.

Singh further reiterated that the coalition government will

continue to work towards meeting the interest of the people and collectively what is best for the nation as a whole.

In a Facebook post, Prime Minister Sitiveni Rabuka said, as promised in the budget, they will review the minimum wages, and people can expect some decisions in the next few months.



Japanese rescuers race to find survivors as quake death toll rises to 78



More than 50 people have been reported missing, as Japanese rescuers battle the cold to reach communities that remain cut off three days after a devastating earthquake struck the country's western coast.

At least 78 people have been

three cities whose whereabouts could not be confirmed.

More than a dozen communities have been cut off.

Soldiers, firefighters and police officers from across Japan are searching through collapsed wooden houses and



confirmed dead and 330 injured since the magnitude 7.6 earthquake off the Noto Peninsula on January 1, according to local authorities. On Thursday, officials published a list of 51 people from toppled commercial buildings for signs of life. Experts say the first three days are especially critical because the prospects for survival drop sharply after that.

"This is a very difficult situa-

tion. But from the viewpoint of protecting lives, I ask that you make every effort to save and rescue as many lives as possible by this evening, when the critical 72 hours of the disaster will have passed," Prime Minister Fumio Kishida said at a government meeting on Thursday. He announced that the number of troops dispatched to the area for rescue operations was being increased from about 1,000 to 4,600. The narrowness of the hard-

hit Noto Peninsula has added to the challenges in reaching some communities. Water, power and mobile phone services were still down in some areas.

There have been nearly 600 aftershocks since the main quake, raising fears of landslides with forecasts of rain adding to the risk.

Naomi Gonno said she and her children got out of their house just as it came crashing down.

Her children were screaming for their grandmother, and Gonno saw that her mother was trapped under the smashed house, with only her hand visible. She was able to squeeze her way out through a tiny space, Gonno said.

"I can't believe we're still alive," she said. "We are living in fear."

No water, power

In Wajima, where a massive fire ripped through parts of the port and the district surrounding it, people queued for water and food.

The quake buckled and tore apart roads, making it even more difficult to access the hardest-hit areas.

"Compared to other disasters, the road situation into Wajima is very bad. I feel it's taking longer than usual for assistance to arrive," Shunsaku Kohriki, a medical worker, told the Reuters news agency. "I think, realistically speaking, the evacuees will have to live in really tough conditions for a while yet."

The full extent of the damage and casualties remains unclear four days after the deadliest quake in Japan since at least 2016.

All the deaths have been reported near the epicentre of the quake in Ishikawa prefecture. More than 33,000 people have evacuated from their homes and about 100,000 houses have no water supply, according to officials in the area. Four of the world's tectonic plates meet in Japan making the country particularly prone to earthquakes.

It experiences hundreds of tremors every year, but most cause little to no damage.

Earthquakes have hit the Noto region with intensifying strength and frequency over the past five years.

In 2011, Japan's northeast was hit by one of the most powerful earthquakes ever recorded.

The magnitude 9.0 undersea earthquake triggered a massive tsunami that wiped out entire communities and triggered a meltdown at the Fukushima nuclear plant. At least 18,500 people were killed.

COVID-19 protective measures reinforced

The Ministry of Health says it has not diagnosed the CO-VID-19 JN.1 sub-variant as reported in other countries.

However, proactive measures are being taken to ensure that the public remain vigilant and take appropriate measures to

protect themselves and those around them.

The Ministry says it has scaled up surveillance through EW-ARS syndromic surveillance system, and through laboratory investigations at the Fiji Centre for Disease Control and at major hospitals around

the country.

It says testing kits have been distributed to the CDC labs in Nadi and Suva, and all Divisional Hospitals around the country to boost the testing for suspected COVID cases presenting at the hospitals. The Ministry of Health also states

that while cases of COVID-19 continue to be seen around the country to date, no rise in cases or admissions have been recorded. Fijians have also been reminded to note that January is the start of the Flu season in the country and it is anticipated that there will be an increase in the number in cases from around the country in the months of January to March. They have also been reminded to follow COVID-safe measures that will protect them from acquiring the disease, and suffering from severe CO-VID-19 disease.



Lee Sun-kyun: Parasite actor, 48, found dead in apparent suicide

South Korean actor Lee Sunkyun, best known for his role in the Oscar-winning film Parasite, has been found dead in an apparent suicide in central Seoul.

Police found the body of the actor, who was 48, in a car near a city park on Wednesday. They believe Lee took his own life, Yonhap news agency reports.

Police said earlier they had received a report that he had left his home after writing a note.

He had been under investigation for alleged illegal drug use since October.

Lee's body was taken to Seoul National University Hospital after police located his car near Waryong Park. Reports say his family have refused an autopsy and he will be buried on Friday.

Police have begun an investigation to establish the details around his death, including when he arrived at the scene where his body was found, and the time of his death.

In Parasite, Lee played the patriarch of the wealthy Park family which is infiltrated by members of a poor family posing as unrelated individuals. The vicious social satire won four Oscars, including best picture.

South Korean film Parasite makes Oscars history The real people living in a 'Parasite' basement 'I try to save others after my little brother's suicide' Yonhap reported that he was suspected of taking drugs such as marijuana and



ketamine with a hostess at a bar in Seoul. He had said that though he took what she gave him, he had not known that they were illicit drugs.

The hostess had reportedly told the police that he used drugs at her home multiple times - something he denied. He had earlier requested through his lawyer to take a lie detector test.

His drug tests had returned negative or inconclusive results, the report added.

Police said they regretted that Lee had died in the midst of investigations, but that the inquiry had been "conducted with [his] consent", News1 Korea reported. Lee underwent three rounds of questioning, with one session last Saturday lasting 19 hours, according to Yonhap.

Lee's agency, HODU&U Entertainment, said in a statement: "There is no way to contain the sorrow and despair. We respectfully ask that you refrain from spreading false facts based on speculation... so that [Lee's] final journey will not be unfair."

News of his death sparked strong reactions online.

"I can't imagine how difficult it must have been for him. Rest in peace," read a comment on one of the news reports.

"Aren't celebrities human? People can make mistakes in their lives. It's so sad," said another. There was also praise for his work. One fan, writing on X (formerly Twitter), wrote: "I laughed and cried a lot while watching your acting. Thank you."

The actor, who was married to actress Jeon Hye-jin and had two young sons with her, had a career spanning more than two decades.

He starred as the lead in dozens of films and TV shows, becoming a household name through the 2010s.

He rose to international fame with Parasite, as it became the first non-English language film to win the Best Picture Oscar.

In South Korea, celebrities are held to high standards of propriety. Lee had a squeakyclean, family-man image prior to his alleged drug use, but reports that emerged from the investigation caused considerable damage to his reputation. Speaking to reporters in late October before going into a police station for questioning, he said: "I sincerely apologise for causing great disappointment to many people by being involved in such an unpleasant incident.

"I feel sorry for my family, which is enduring such difficult pain at this moment."

Lee was dropped from No Way Out, a mystery TV series that began shooting in October. According to reports, some businesses were seen taking down posters and advertisements featuring Lee from their stores.

Drug offences, including those involving usage of marijuana, are considered serious crimes in South Korea. Consumption of marijuana carries prison sentences of up to five years.

South Korean President Yoon Suk Yeol has vowed a crackdown on drugs. This year, the country's authorities expanded its drug crimes department and the national police chief promised "a total war" on drug crimes.

Lee is not the only South Korean celebrity who had been investigated for drug use recently. Earlier this month, Kpop star G-Dragon was cleared of drug allegations after weeks of investigations.

Actor Yoo Ah-in is currently standing trial for drug use.



Former US police officer sentenced in killing of Black man Elijah McClain

Randy Roedema handed 14-month sentence for 2019 killing of McClain, who was put in a chokehold, injected with ketamine.



A former police officer in the western US state of Colorado has been sentenced to 14 months in jail for his role in the 2019 killing of Elijah Mc-Clain, a Black man who was not suspected of any crime when police roughly restrained him and paramedics injected him with a powerful

sedative.

Before the judge handed down the sentence on Friday, McClain's mother, Sheneen McClain, condemned Randy Roedema, the only law enforcement official to be found guilty.

"Randy Roedema stole my son's life," she said. "All

the belated apologies in the world can't remove my son's blood from Randy Roedema's hands."

She also called the sentence "a slap on the wrist".

Roedema was found guilty in October of criminally negligent homicide and third-degree assault. The same jury found fellow police officer Jason Rosenblatt not guilty in a joint trial.

Police confronted McClain, 23, on the night of August 24, 2019, after a bystander called 911 to report that a man was dressed in a winter coat and ski mask on a warm night, and was acting suspiciously as he walked home from a convenience store.

Police laid hands on McClain within seconds of stopping him and put him in a carotid chokehold at least twice. He vomited into his ski mask and repeatedly told officers he could not breathe.

The original autopsy conducted on McClain in 2019 found the cause of death to be "undetermined". However, a revised autopsy report in 2021 concluded McClain died from "complications of ketamine administration following forcible restraint".

In a separate trial, two paramedics were convicted last month of criminally negligent homicide for injecting Mc-Clain with an overdose of the sedative ketamine. They are due to be sentenced in March.

Local prosecutors initially declined to file charges and McClain's killing received little attention. That changed following the May 2020 killing of George Floyd, a Black man who died at the hands of Minneapolis police.

One killed, five wounded in Iowa school shooting

Police identify shooter on first day of classes at Perry Middle and High School as 17-year-old Dylan Butler.

A teenager armed with a shotgun and a handgun opened fire at a high school in the US state of Iowa killing a sixth grader and injuring five others, authorities said.

The shooting at Perry Middle and High School on the first day of classes took place just after 7:30am (13:30 GMT) on Thursday, police said.

The shooter was identified by authorities as 17-year-old Dylan Butler, who attended the school. He died of what investigators believe was a self-inflicted gunshot wound, an Iowa Division of Criminal Investigation official revealed.

Butler had a pump-action shotgun and a small-calibre handgun, authorities said. Mitch Mortvedt, the state investigation division's assistant director, said during a news conference that authorities also found a "pretty rudimentary" improvised explosive device and rendered it safe.

The suspect's motive was being investigated and authorities were looking into "a number of social media posts" he made about the time of the shooting, Mortvedt added.

He said one person was in critical condition, but the injuries did not appear to be life-threatening, and the others were stable.

An administrator, later identified by his alma mater as the school's principal, Dan Marburger, was among those injured as students returned from winter break.

There were few students and faculty in the building at the time of the incident, Dallas County Sheriff Adam Infante said.

Rachael Kares, 18, told



The Assoiated Press news agency that she was finishing jazz band practice when she and her bandmates heard what she described as four gunshots spaced apart. "We all just jumped," Kares said. "My band teacher looked at us and yelled 'Run!' So, we ran."

Kares added that she ran out past the football field with others from the school and heard people yelling, "Get out! Get Out!" as more gunshots were heard. FBI and United States Bureau

of Alcohol, Tobacco, Firearms and Explosives (ATF) agents responded to the scene.



FAA Orders Grounding of Some Boeing 737 MAX-9 Jets After Emergency Landing

The Federal Aviation Administration said Saturday it will temporarily ground some Boeing 737 Max 9 airplanes used by U.S. airlines after a chunk of a wall appeared to have detached from an Alaska Airlines flight midair.

"The FAA is requiring immediate inspections of certain Boeing 737 Max 9 planes before they can return to flight," FAA Administrator Mike Whitaker said. "Safety will continue to drive our decision-making as we assist the [National Transportation Safety Board's] investigation into Alaska Airlines Flight 1282."

The FAA said it will also ground 737 Max 9 planes that operate in U.S. territory. In total, the order will affect about 171 737 Max 9 airplanes out of 218 worldwide, the FAA said.

The FAA said in a directive that the decision to ground all 737 Max 9 planes stems from "a report of an in-flight departure of a mid cabin doorplug, which resulted in a rapid decompression of the airplane," referring to the Alaska Airlines incident. The agency added that it is issuing this directive because of unsafe conditions that could potentially occur in a similar scenario in another aircraft of the same model, including "injury to passengers and crew, the door impacting the airplane, and/or loss of control of the airplane."

Boeing said it supports the FAA's decision.

"Safety is our top priority and we deeply regret the impact this event has had on our customers and their passengers," Boeing said in a statement. "We agree with and fully support the FAA's decision to require immediate inspections of 737-9 airplanes with the same configuration as the affected airplane."

A Boeing technical team is supporting the NTSB's investigation, the statement read.

"We will remain in close contact with our regulator and customers," Boeing said.

Alaska Airline temporarily grounded all 65 of its 737 Max 9 aircraft Saturday for maintenance and safety inspections. It said a quarter of the inspections were completed "with no concerning findings" and so far 18 aircraft were cleared to return to service on Saturday. The remaining aircraft inspections are expected to be completed in the next few days.

United also temporarily suspended service on select Boeing 737 Max 9 aircraft to conduct an inspection. The removal is expected to cause about 60 cancellations.


'A loud bang'

Flight 1282, which was bound for Southern California, landed safety at Portland International Airport, Port of Portland spokesperson Allison Ferre said in a statement.

So far, no injuries have been reported among the 174 passengers and six crew members on board, Alaska Airlines said.

The FAA said the plane returned to the airport after "the crew reported a pressurization issue."

Alaska Airlines described what happened as an "incident." A photo from a passenger on board showed an entire panel missing from a side of the fuselage, next to a row of seats.



It's not clear how or when the panel became separated from the passenger jet. According to FlightAware, an air travel tracking site, the flight took off from Portland at 5:07 p.m. and landed back at Portland at

5:27 p.m. Alaska said in a statement, "The safety of our guests and employees is always our primary priority, so while this type of occurrence is rare, our flight crew was trained and prepared to safely manage the situa-tion."

The flight was destined for Ontario International Airport in San Bernardino County, California.

Secretary of Transportation Pete Buttigieg said on X Saturday morning that he has "been briefed on last night's incident and remain[s] in close contact with FAA on the response."

2 people killed, 9 injured in pileup that closed fog-shrouded I-5 in California



Two people were killed and nine others were injured Saturday in a massive pileup on Interstate 5 in California involving 35 vehicles as thick fog impeded visibility, authorities said.

The deadly pileup occurred on the southbound side of the freeway in Kern County but both sides were closed and traffic was diverted, the California Department of Transportation, known as Caltrans, said on X.

Emergency responders were called around 7:30 a.m. on a col-

lision report, according to NBC affiliate KGET 17 News in Bakersfield.

Caltrans said the pileup occurred during foggy weather conditions, known in the San Joaquin Valley as Tule fog, which covers the ground in a heavy mist after rain saturates the soil.

Seventeen vehicles and 18 big rigs were involved in the pileup, KBAK reported. Fire department Battalion Chief Jim Calhoun told the station that two people died and nine others were taken to the hospital in unknown conditions.

Just as the world was getting ready to celebrate the spirit of Christmas, I received a call from Dr.Raju, the prior Honorary Consul for Fiji based in South San Francisco. He says that he is aware of a young lady who is a recent migrant from Fiji but due to unfortunate circumstances is now unhoused and sleeping outside somewhere in Hayward California. He wanted me to help her out of her current predicament. It seemed like an impossible task trying to find an individual without an address. Dr Raju gave me a phone number saying that she may be reachable through this phone number. I managed to locate Keshni and we mutually decided to meet at a local store on Tennyson Road

in Hayward. My heart sank when I saw her condition and her dire need for help.

She told me her name was Reshni Lata and she had arrived in this country recently. She said her husband married her in Fiji, brought her over and then left her. Said she had no family support, so she ended up on the street. Reshni said she was currently sleeping with total strangers next to the train tracks off Tennyson Road in Hayward.

Reshni related how she had been living on the streets and in and out of shelters for more than six months.

I asked her what her immediate needs were. She said that she had not eaten for three days and that she needed a tarp to cover her temporary shelter from the winter storms. That her belongings were wet during the recent rains....and a board to lay down on the ground to keep her shelter dry. She mentioned that all her legal documents were stolen, and it was very difficult for her to get help from the authorities. She said she did not want to go back to Fiji and be a burden on her parents and a laughingstock for the family. She wanted to eventually work and support herself and her ailing parents in Fiji. It was getting late in the afternoon, and I decided to buy her a new waterproof tent and gave her some funds to buy food for the night. With Reshni's permission I posted her picture and story on social media. The response was overwhelming. Individuals from Hayward, other parts of

California, Seattle, Australia, New Zealand and Fiji volunteered to help by providing shelter, professional resources and funds for her wellbeing. That same day members of the local community and USAFiji.com came out to offer Reshni their assistance in whichever way possible.

Finally, it was decided to place Reshni with Priscilla Singh of Newark, Ca. Priscilla promised to provide Reshni with food, shelter, psychological counseling, and job placement. Reshni is currently living with Priscilla and slowly getting her life together. She is getting help gathering her legal documents. We wish Reshni all the best and are ready to support her in whatever it takes for a speedy integration. I received more than 150 calls that day offering help and a few calls requesting help. It is imperative that we set up avenues for support and referrals in our community. Just a contact phone number and a list of available resources in your neighborhood can be a life saver.

Gardi Sugdub: The Americas' disappearing island



For more than 100 years, the Indigenous Guna people have lived on a tiny Caribbean island. Now, they're poised to become some of the Americas' first climate change refugees. Set some 1,200m off Panama's northern coast in the San Blas archipelago, the tiny Caribbean island of Gardi Sugdub (sometimes written Cartí Sugdub) is home to nearly 1,300 members of the Indigenous Guna community. After surviving Spanish colonisation in the early 1500s, it is believed that a combination of factors (including disease, venomous snakes and clashes with other Indigenous groups) led the Guna to settle along a series of 49 islands as well as a strip of coastline in what is now the Guna Yala autonomous region in the 19th Century.

But after inhabiting this 400mby-150m island for more than 100 years, Gardi Sugdub's residents will soon be forced to abandon their island home – and that's because the island may soon disappear under the sea.

Since the 1990s, residents on the densely packed island have noticed that their thatched- and tin-roof homes are flooding more and more, especially during the November-to-February rainy season. According to the Smithsonian Tropical Research Institute, the sea around Gardi Sugdub is now rising 3.4mm per year (more than double the rate during the 1960s). Since most of the Guna-inhabited islands lie only 0.5m to 1m above the water, "it is almost certain that all the islands will have to be abandoned by 2100," said Steve Paton, the director of the Institute's oceanographic monitoring programme.

As sea levels continue to rise, the same ocean that has historically helped to preserve the Guna's culture, language and colourful mola clothing is threatening its very survival. Yet, unlike other Guna communities affected by climate change, the residents of Gardi Sugdub have a plan. In 2010, the island's leaders began working with the Panamanian government to develop a new village on the mainland from which they once fled. Known as Isber Yala, the planned community is being built by the islanders on land they already own. At first glance, Isber Yala couldn't be more different from Gardi Sugdub: instead of tightly packed wooden and metal houses facing the sea, the new community is comprised of prefabricated concrete homes set several kilometres from the ocean. Families are scheduled to begin relocating from the island to the new community in February 2024, and when they do, the Guna will be among the first climate refugees in the Americas. The 365 islands that comprise the San Blas archipelago are renowned for their beauty and are mostly uninhabited. Gardi Sugdub is by far the most densely populated of the 38 islands and 11 mainland communities where the Guna live. To reach Gardi Sugdub (whose name means Crab Island in the native Guna language), you can either drive 110km north-east from Panama City to the coastal settlement of Cartí or take a short flight to the Cartí airport. From there, the only way to arrive on the island is via a boat-taxi operated by local Guna members, which operate every few hours. Whether building dugout canoes to fish in the surrounding sea or paddling to the mainland to harvest building materials, the Guna have developed a unique cultural identity that's inextricably linked to their environment. According to Blas López, one of the community leaders involved in the construction of Isber

Yala, being evacuated from Gardi Sugdub could disrupt the islanders' culture. "Now, after [hundreds of] years, the community of [Gardi] Sugdub is going to move and this will have an impact on them, so a process of adaptation will be necessary for the people in this new environment," he said.

When Panama gained its independence from Colombia in 1903, the Guna (who had historically straddled the Colombia-Panama border) were divided and Panama's nascent government embarked on a campaign to "civilise" the Guna. The forced assimilation was intended to rid the Guna of their language, dress and traditions, but the Guna resisted. This resistance culminated on 25 February 1925 when the Guna declared their independence. Though this revolution, known as La Revolución Dule ("The Dule Revolution", referring to the word the Guna use to call themselves: "Dule" or "People") barely lasted a week, it initiated a peace agreement that allowed the Guna to maintain their traditions and granted them a level of political autonomy they enjoy to this day. One of the most important elements of this autonomy is the saila (a political and religious leader) who oversees each Guna village from a Congress House. "The Congress House, called Onmaket Nega in the Guna language, is a fundamental element for our community. It has enormous cultural value and is [where] the population is summoned to discuss social and community problems. It also has a fundamental spiritual and Indigenous worldview, since this is where the saila transmits all [Guna] ancestral knowledge through songs," said López. "It is a place where harmony with nature is taught, with the sea, the forests and all the elements that make up us [Guna] as an Indigenous community." The Guna inhabiting the San Blas archipelago have historically made their livelihoods off fishing - and were even known to provide seafood to some of the finest restaurants in Panama City. But in recent years, as access to the Pan-American highway has improved, rising sea level and overcrowding on Gardi Sugdub has intensified and the destruction of nearby coral

reefs has accelerated, fishing has become more challenging. As a result, many islanders have turned to tourism. Some now transport tourists with their taxi-boats from the mainland to Gardi Sugdub and other nearby islands, while others have opened small restaurants and modest lodgings on nearby islands where tourists can stay overnight surrounded by idyllic landscapes. There is even a tiny museum on Gardi Sugdub dedicated to Guna culture. Traditional Guna clothing is quite striking, especially in the case of women who wear traditional garments called molas whose vibrant prints are inspired by the flowers, birds, reptiles and plants that inhabit the Guna Yala region. According to some historians, molas come from an earlier time when the Guna painted their bodies to scare away spirits. This paint completely covered one's front, back and sides, because the Guna believe that the Universe is made up of different levels in which there is no empty space. It usually takes between 60 and 80 hours to hand-sew each cotton mola, and the reverse applique method of layering each design is traditionally taught by mothers to daughters. Since the Panamanian government actively tried to eradicate molas prior to The Dule Revolution, they remain an important symbol of the Guna's identity and autonomy. "I have been quite affected by the rise in sea levels because I live near the water, so every time the tide rises, the water enters my home," said Magdalena Martínez, who owns a small convenience store on Gardi Sugdub. "This is something that has always happened here, but recently it has been occurring in a much more violent way." Rising sea levels isn't the only reason Gardi Sugdub is becoming uninhabitable. According to a report by Human Rights Watch, the island was nearly half its current size when it was first settled, but over the years residents have taken the surrounding coral reefs, garbage, rocks and cement blocks to expand the landmass. While this "filling" practice has helped create more space on the island (whose highest point is just 1m above the sea) the destruction of the coral reefs that historically buffered it from storms has also left it more susceptible to erosion and flooding. Furthermore, since there is no proper sewage system, most human waste ends up in the ocean, which causes diseases for those who swim in it. Despite years of "filling", Gardi Sugdub now faces a huge population density problem, as it has become impossible to build more houses. Hygienic and sanitary conditions are also poor as the island doesn't have reliable access to clean water. An underwater water pipe reaches Gardi Sugdub, but it frequently runs dry, leaving residents to paddle to a river on the mainland to get fresh water. And while some residents proposed relocating the community to a larger nearby island, studies have shown that rising sea levels are affecting the entire archipelago to such an extent that by 2050, scientists believe many others near Gardi Sugdub won't be inhabitable. "We are all affected in one way or another by the rise in sea level, because every time it rains and the sea level rises, our house looks like a swimming pool and we sleep on top of that pool. For the future of the community, it is better for us to move inland, although in my opinion, I don't know if that is going to be the solution because in a few years the water may even reach the new community. Furthermore, I also believe that this is a problem that not only affects our community, but also affects the entire Guna Yala región," said Dalys Morris, a schoolteacher on Gardi Sugdub.

After years of delays, Isber Yala's 300 homes are finally expected to be completed in February 2024, at which point families are supposed to begin evacuating the island. According to López, there is still a lot of work to do - including creating a water sanitation system - and he remains sceptical that Isber Yala will be inhabitable next month. Still, with each prefabricated house designed to have electricity and access to clean drinking water, and the community equipped with a health centre and a brandnew Congress House, Isber Yala could provide the residents of Gardi Sugdub the one thing they currently lack: a secure future.

The 16-year-old who's become the U.K.'s unlikely sports icon



Teenage darts sensation Luke Littler said he would prepare for Wednesday's final the way he normally does for any match, by eating a ham-andcheese omelette followed by a pizza.

He is only 16. But Luke Littler has risen to sudden stardom in Britain with an unlikely run that has him on the verge of a world title.

Littler has become a sensation after making it into the World Darts Championship final as an unseeded player. Millions will be tuning in Wednesday to watch his bid to become the youngest winner of the sport's most prestigious competition. The teenager — who goes by "Luke TheNuke Littler" on Instagram, where he has amassed a following of more than 500,000 — has outclassed world champions on his way to the final, winning the hearts of raucous crowds at London's Alexandra Palace and viewers across the country over the holiday period.

"No words! Crazy to think I'm in a World Championship final in my debut," Littler told NBC's U.K. partner network Sky Sports after his semifinal win against 2018 champion Rob Cross on Tuesday. "I was happy winning one game but I could go all the way!"

Littler's fairy-tale ascent from youth world champion to the cusp of the senior title has transcended the world of darts, winning him fans and celebrity admirers across the U.K., with the British media dubbing him a "prodigy" on front pages.

English soccer stars have asked him to pose for photos, and a British prostate cancer charity celebrated Littler for wearing its logo on his shirt throughout the tournament and spreading awareness.

But due to his age, little is known about the teen, and he has admitted that media attention is very new to him. The Professional Darts Corporation, or PDC, lists Littler on its website as born in 2007 and from the town of Warrington, in northern England.

Last week Littler, who was number 164 in the PDC rankings, shared a video of himself playing darts at 18-monthsold, while still wearing a diaper.

"It's completely unprecedented," British darts commentator Rod Studd told NBC News. "What normally happens in darts is people develop their skill, develop their ability to play on big stages in front of TV cameras and huge crowds, and it takes a lot of time."

But Littler managed to take the biggest stage in darts by storm.

"People knew that Luke Littler was a promising talent and possibly a prodigiously promising talent," Studd said. "He won the World Youth Championship earlier this year. But that's a big step from what's happening in the world championship against seasoned professional players that have won big tournaments many, many times."

Match after match, Littler has performed at "stratospheric levels" usually seen from established elite-level players, Studd said, with supreme confidence where "nothing appears to bother him" under pressure.

"It's as if he is throwing darts in his own lounge room," he said. "This boy is making this look so effortlessly easy."

Littler's combination of confidence, accuracy and style has won him an army of fans, Studd said, who may not have even known him just weeks ago when the tournament kicked off.

A former junior coach told British public broadcaster the

BBC on Wednesday that he recognized Littler's talent before he was 11. "'I'd say he's the Ronaldo of darts," Karl Holden said. "He is a freak of nature."

If he wins Wednesday, Littler will become the youngest world champion in PDC history, Studd said, with Dutch player Michael van Gerwen winning the title at age 24 in 2014.

"Twenty-four was considered young, so 16 is just beyond belief," he added.

The teenager told Sky Sports he will prepare for the final the way he does for any match, namely by eating a ham-andcheese omelet in the morning, followed by a pizza and then practice later in the day. He has also told the BBC that he loves to celebrate his wins with a good kebab.

He will face fellow English player Luke Humphries in Wednesday's final, where they will compete for a 500,000-pound (\$631,000) prize. Littler has already guaranteed himself a minimum of 200,000 pounds (\$252,000) in prize money, according to the PDC.

Humphries said ahead of the match that he thought Littler was "scarily good" when he played him when Littler was just 12 years old.

"He has shown that he is the real deal and regardless of what happens tomorrow, he has got a massive bright future," Humphries said Tuesday.

Fifa rankings: Women's World Cup winners Spain reach top spot

Women's World Cup winners Spain have reached the top of the Fifa rankings for the first time as England remain fourth.


Spain beat England 1-0 in the World Cup final in August and become the fourth team to hold the top spot.

Previous leaders Sweden drop to fifth, with the USA up one spot to second and France climbing two into third.

Scotland slide two places to 25th with Wales dropping

three spots to 32nd, while Northern Ireland are 46th. Germany, the Netherlands and Japan hold on to their places in sixth, seventh and eighth respectively, with North Korea sitting ninth and Canada completing the top 10.

Brazil, who failed to get out of the group stage at this year's World Cup for the first time since 1995, lose their place in the top 10 after falling two places to 11th.



Some People with Diabetes Are Turning to DIY Devices. It's a Bad Idea

The Food and Drug Administration (FDA) is warning consumers against using unapproved devices for managing diabetes because of the risk of serious adverse health effects. The announcement comes in response to an incident in which a patient suffered an insulin overdose after using one such device. "By using products that have not been reviewed by the agency for safety and effectiveness, patients with diabetes may be putting themselves at risk for serious injury or even death," said Dr. Jeff Shuren, JD, director of the FDA's Center for Devices and Radiological Health, in a statement.Trusted Source Despite the apparent risks, unapproved devices may appear attractive to some people because of the cost or availability of FDA-approved devices. What are these devices for? Diabetes management devices include multiple systems that can work in concert with one another to monitor blood glucose and deliver insulin to the bloodstream. A continuous glucose monitoring system uses data from a sensor embedded under the skin to track glucose levels. An insulin pump is attached to the skin and delivers insulin into the bloodstream via a catheter. An automated insulin dosing system is designed to do both:

measure glucose from a monitoring system and automatically appropriate doses of insulin. In some cases, devices for managing diabetes are only designed to work together as a whole system; in other cases parts are designed so that they can essentially be swapped out for other approved parts — known as "interoperability." DIY diabetes devices The FDA authorized the first-ever interoperable insulin pump in February 2019Trusted Source. The agency has stated that these devices give people greater freedom to "tailor their diabetes management to their individual device preferences." However, the FDA warns that unapproved versions of these devices can be dangerous even if used within approved systems. The market for unapproved interoperable devices - where parts claim they can be added to approved devices, but have not been vetted — has also led to a scenario in which some patients are creating their own ad hoc diabetes management systems by wiring together in a chain interoperable parts and systems. These do-it-yourself (DIY) systems use an insulin pump, continuous glucose monitor (CGM), and insulin dosing algorithm to create a closedloop system similar to that of the current FDA approved systems,



Dr. Kevin Pantalone, DO, an endocrinologist at Cleveland Clinic, told Healthline. However, diabetes management devices rely on complex algorithms to convert blood glucose data received from the sensor into values that are readable by insulin dosing devices. Pairing different devices together can therefore result in inaccurate and potentially dangerous doses of insulin. "There are numerous algorithms and devices out there that can be paired by patients to develop a DIY system. This is a concern, as these algorithms and pairings have not been studied in controlled trials, so their effectiveness and more importantly their safety, are largely unknown and

based on anecdotal experiences," Pantalone said. In a safety communication issued by the FDA, it warned that use of these devices can result in complications that may require medical intervention or hospitalization including low blood sugar, coma, diabetic ketoacidosis, and death. This is not the first time the FDA has warned people with diabetes about unapproved or "gray market" products for managing the condition. In April 2019, the agency issued a statementTrusted Source discouraging consumers from purchasing pre-owned test strips or unauthorized test strips for blood glucose monitoring. The agency found that unauthorized test strips were frequently sold

through online marketplaces including Amazon, eBay, and Craigslist. But the FDA was less forthcoming in their new warning about where people were able to purchase unauthorized diabetes management devices. In an email to Healthline, a spokesperson for the FDA declined to comment further on the names of any brands, parts, manufacturers, or vendors of the unauthorized devices, explaining that the FDA does not comment on specific companies. The spokesperson also declined to comment on where the unauthorized devices are coming from and whether they were being imported or manufactured domestically.

Common Diet Supplement May Help with Heart Health

A popular and widely used dietary supplement for joint pain could also be beneficial for your heart. According to new researchTrusted Source published in The BMJ, habitual use of the supplement glucosamine was found to be associated with a significantly lower risk of cardiovascular disease (CVD) and its more severe consequences like stroke. However, researchers point out that despite this association, their work doesn't establish a causal link between glucosamine and better CVD outcomes. "Our study suggests a potential new beneficial effect of glucosamine on cardiovascular health. The practical implication would be upon further evidence from future studies,

such as clinical trials, that verify such effects as causal," said Dr. Lu Qi, a professor in the department of epidemiology at Tulane University and one of the study's authors. Nonetheless, the data from the study is robust. Glucosamine and a potentially healthier heart? Using national health resources in the United Kingdom, Qi and his colleagues looked at results of nearly a half-million people. Individuals reported supplement use and were followed, in some cases, up to 10 years. During that time any events related to CVD were recorded. None of the study participants had CVD at the start of the study. During the follow-up time, those who reported using glucosamine had

a 15 percent lower overall risk of CVD events. It was further associated with a 9 to 22 percent lower risk of CVD death, coronary heart disease, and stroke, compared to nonusers. Other experts say that the results look promising, but more work needs to be done to establish a mechanism for glucosamine's potential benefits for heart health. "The event reduction effects attributed to glucosamine will need to be proven in a randomized control study looking at a specific dose, specific formulation, and regimen," said Dr. Guy L. Mintz, director of cardiovascular health and lipidology at Sandra Atlas Bass Heart Hospital in Manhasset, New

York. "I think this is a promising

first step in looking for another tool to reduce cardiovascular events." Mintz wasn't affiliated with the study. This isn't the first study to take note of glucosamine's beneficial relationship with CVD. Its results are in line with an Australian study from 2012Trusted Source of 266,848 adults 45 years and older. Researchers found a negative association between taking glucosamine, heart disease, and other cardiovascular conditions. The authors of that study noted that this "revealing" finding warranted further investigation.

COPD Tends to Hit Women Harder Than It Does Men

Women with chronic obstructive pulmonary disease (COPD) experience worse symptoms than men with the same condition. The big question now facing medical professionals is why. Researchers have found women living with COPD report a lower quality of life than men with the disease, despite also reporting smoking fewer cigarettes. The findings are scheduled to be presented at the American Thoracic Society's international conference in Dallas this week. "Women with COPD experienced increased symptom burden, poorer quality of life, more frequent exacerbations, and more impaired functional status than their male counterparts," Dr. MeiLan Han, author of the study and a professor of internal medicine in the division of pulmonary and critical care medicine at the University of Michigan Health System, told Healthline. COPD is a term used to describe a number of progressive lung diseases, including chronic bronchitis, emphysema, and nonreversible asthma. Common symptoms include shortness of breath, wheezing, frequent coughing, and tightness in the chest. COPD is a progressive disease with no known cure. In the United States, more than 11 million people have COPD, but experts say millions more are likely living with the disease without realizing it. Many may dismiss shortness of breath or a cough as just part of getting older, but experts say it can be a sign of something more serious. "COPD can significantly impact quality of life. Patients with more advanced COPD struggle to breathe and experience a sensation of air hunger. Patients may be limited in their activities of daily living, and even leaving their home can be a challenge. Sleep quality is impaired in patients with COPD, and daytime energy levels are decreased," Dr. Gaurav Singh, a clinical assistant professor of pulmonary and critical care medicine at Stanford University, told Healthline. COPD is the third-leading cause of death from disease in the United States. Women are more likely to die from COPD than men.

"Women are more susceptible and more vulnerable than men with regard to COPD. Faster decline in lung function with more severe airflow limitation, as well as increased symptom burden related to COPD in women compared to men, has been reported in other studies. Compared to men, women experience more shortness of breath, more depression and anxiety, and lower quality of life," Singh said. Women more affected by COPD The research presented this week shows that women are more likely to report lower quality of life than men living with the same condition. Dr. May-Lin Wilgus, a co-author of the study and assistant clinical professor in the division of pulmonary and critical care at the David Geffen School of Medicine at the University of California, Los Angeles, says this is in keeping with what she sees in her own practice. "Women are

an assistant professor in the division of pulmonary and critical care medicine at the University of California Davis School of Medicine, says COPD can significantly affect patient mood. "One of my colleagues refers to this as 'death by armchair,' as the impaired pulmonary function leads to the patients not being able to do activities of daily living and normal activities that give them pleasure. As their disease progresses, their ability to interact with the world around them decreases, and hence their mood is negatively affected," Kuhn told Healthline. The impact of smoking The main cause of COPD in the United States is smoking, with about 90 percent of COPD cases attributable to cigarettes. Despite this, women with COPD report smoking less than men with the same disease. Experts say this may be because tobacco smoke affects women more severely than

genetic factors that determine how women's bodies react to and metabolize cigarette smoke may also be responsible," Singh said. "The fact that women develop COPD with less smoking than men suggests that women are more susceptible to developing COPD. This has been confirmed in several studies, with women being about 50 percent more likely to develop COPD than men. "Women experience greater decline in lung function, resulting in more severe airflow limitation, compared to men, even with a less extensive history of smoking cigarettes," he added. powered by Rubicon Project Not just men Historically, COPD was predominantly considered to be a disease of older men. In the late 1960s, tobacco companies began targeting women, and as a result, more women began smoking. Despite more women presenting with symptoms that could

typically also have more exposure to indoor air pollution from biofuel exposure during cooking in developing countries. Women tend to be diagnosed with COPD at a more advanced stage compared to men, due to biased views that COPD is more common in men. Awareness of the increased prevalence of COPD and adverse outcomes due to COPD in women, which now surpass rates in men, is essential," he said. Given the potential bias against women receiving diagnoses of the disease, Wilgus says patients, particularly smokers, should be proactive in speaking with their doctor. "The symptoms of COPD can develop even decades after quitting smoking. Any current or former smokers who experience breathlessness, cough, or wheeze should be checked for COPD by their physicians, which generally includes a breathing test called



attuned to their symptoms and tend to seek medical care when symptomatic. In addition, women with COPD are more likely to have comorbid anxiety and depression as compared to men with COPD, which may affect perception of COPD respiratory symptoms," Wilgus told Healthline. Tyrrell Hatton in contention despite travel woes and body aches

KAPALUA, Hawaii — Tyrrell Hatton being in tournament contention has become routine over the past five years, but his name atop The Sentry's leaderboards this week is somewhat surprising considering his troubles getting here.

Hatton took the clubhouse lead early Friday thanks to an 11-under 62, a career-best score for the Englishman. It was highlighted by a 30 on the back and an eagle at the 18th. Hatton is normally hard on himself, even in success, but he agreed it was a special display ... mostly because he feels like hell from this trip.

"If I'm being honest, body didn't feel great, and tee to green wasn't, didn't feel amazing," Hatton said Friday at the Plantation course. "I had a mad day on the greens. Every putt I seemed to look at went in, which is a nice feeling."

Hatton explained his body was feeling stiff, which sounds pretty generic and doesn't exactly help the "Are golfers athletes?" argument. But Hatton has a reasonable excuse for being banged up, his trip from England to Hawaii taking close to 26 hours door-to-door, which included some wait time on the runway thanks to mechanical issues.

"Heathrow [airport] to L.A., then we had a threehour stop over in L.A., sat on that plane for 90 minutes," Hatton explained, "so you have to get off that plane, wait another hour and a half to get on another plane. Then you fly from L.A. here and land, yeah, about four hours later or three hours later than you had planned."

Not helping matters was that Hatton admittedly is not in the best of shape following the holidays. "I wouldn't say I looked after myself in the December period, maybe that played a part," Hatton said, smiling. "Yeah, so body hasn't been moving well. I'm sure if you had seen some flight tracers of some of my tee shots you would be dis gusted."

Hatton is being a tad hard



on himself, as he still had a positive SG/approach figure on the afternoon. However, he beat his Round 1 score by seven shots, thanks to his putting, gaining more than 3.4 strokes on the green Friday. That didn't account for a 97-foot putt he dropped just off the putting surface on 18, allowing Hatton to finish five under on his final four holes. "I guess it shows how much of a stupid game it is," Hatton said. "Obviously, I putted amazing today, that's the big thing for how my score ended up as low as it was. Yeah, with how bad my body felt, I'm surprised that, going out this morning, that score was just not even entering my mind."

It will be interesting to see how Hatton fares this weekend now that he's loosened up. The feeling may be shortlived, though. After playing down the road at the Sony Open next week, he's making the trip to Dubai, then to Orlando before heading to California for the West Coast Swing.

"I mean, I'm a plank of wood as it is, by the end of that trip it's going to be brutal," Hatton said.

Former Flying Fijians coach Simon Raiwalui believed the impact of their Rugby World Cup outing was huge for Fiji in pushing 15s rugby.

Raiwalui said the sport had grown in both the men's and women's space, something Fiji Rugby wanted to do for quite a while.

No excuses | Serevi: We have players, we play more



The physicality and competitiveness of other teams in the HSBC Sevens Series should not be an excuse for the below par performance of the Fiji Airways Fiji men's 7s team.

Waisale Serevi, regarded as the best 7s player, in an interview with this newspaper blatantly laid out the harsh reality of the current national 7s team that has been on a winless run in the past 15 tournaments.

Fiji last tasted glory on the world series at the Toulouse 7s in 2022.

Fiji 7s head coach Ben Gollings had highlighted time and again of how physical the series had grown, and his team would need to match that.

Serevi, who is coaching Tabadamu during the Ranger Viti Natusara 7s tournament along with former national representative Emosi Mulevoro, reminded the national team that Fijians are made to play sevens rugby.

"I believe it comes to a time now that people are talking about the HSBC tournament as tougher. Some of the coaches are saying that it is getting tougher. We are made to play 7s rugby and I believe the reason I said they need soul-searching is because we haven't gone to win any for the last 14 or so tournaments which is a record itself, a couple of tournaments we didn't even reach the quarterfinals," said the 7s legend.

"We have the players, we play more tournaments than any other team in the world, we have the experience, and we cannot say that they are better than us.

"If you say that then it is not good for us. We need to try and get better now, Fiji is not going up or down, its stagnant so other teams have found a way to go one up.

"That one up must come from the coaches, the assistant coaches and all the players. They must find a way to get there.

"I want the players to know the people of Fiji are supporting them, people are talking and criticising because they've seen where we are now. It's not because we don't like them, it's the reality, it's the national 7s team.

"They must remember we are the Olympics champions, the world cup champions, and they must make sure to work hard and show that we are the best 7s team in the world."

With the new year came new opportunities and the upcoming

Perth 7s in Australia is a chance for the Fiji 7s team to prove they have learned from past losses.

"The good thing is we have a tournament coming up in Perth and they should lift their hands and say that they are ready to start winning tournaments," Serevi said.

"I believe we should learn from all the games we've played. The number of tournaments we have played is enough games to look at and see where are going. They must figure out their defensive structure and organise their attacking structure so that they can work together.

"Now the teams that are playing as a team are winning tournaments, yes, we are individual players, but we need to find a way to play together as a team in attack and in defence."

Serevi and Mulevoro, who will lead Tabadamu to the Mc-Donald's Fiji's Coral Coast Sevens, wished the team well in their upcoming tournaments especially the Olympics Games in France.

Cristiano Ronaldo Wins 1st Prize in 2024, Scoops Maradona Award

Ronaldo had a strange year in 2023. Following Portugal's early 2022 World Cup exit and a tarnished relationship with Manchester United, he left Europe to embrace the riches of Saudi Arabia.

He was among the first European stars to move to the Middle East, setting the tone for an unprecedented shift in world football dynamics, which made the Saudi Pro League one of the world's most attractive destinations.

Despite switching to the desert in the autumn of his illustrious playing career, the 38-year-old has preserved his ever-present desire to win and score goals.

Even though his trophy-laden playing career is nearing its end, he shows no signs of slowing down. The numbers never lie. In Ronaldo's case, they're staggering.

In addition to averaging 0.88 goals per game for Al-Nassr,

the Portugal captain excelled at international level, playing a prominent role in the Selecao's historic European Championship 2024 qualifying cycle.

Led by new manager Roberto Martinez, the Euro 2016 winners steamrolled to the top of Group J with ten victories, a feat they never achieved throughout their storied history. Ronaldo's contribution was immense. Alongside Man Utd ace Bruno Fernandes, he soaked up the limelight as Portugal's standout performer, rolling back the years to net ten goals in nine matches in 2023.

Only Belgium stalwart Romelu Lukaku's haul of 14 goals bettered the Portuguese superstar's tally in Euro 2024 qualifying, showing he's still a force to be reckoned with even at 38.

With 54 goals for club and country, Ronaldo finished

2023 as the world's most prolific player, and it took him only 59 games to hit this outrageous figure.

Some people would argue he's no longer playing at the top level, yet it takes nothing away from the ex-Sporting Lisbon prodigy's everlasting appetite for scoring.

However, Ronaldo was not the only player to smash a 50goal barrier in 2023. Three other European powerhouses joined this select club.

New Bayern Munich talisman Harry Kane hit the ground running in the Bundesliga from the outset, as he heads into 2024 as the division's topscorer with 21 goals.

Kane only needed 15 league appearances to hit a 20-goal landmark, which, combined with his splendid scoring record for Tottenham Hotspur and England, took his overall tally to 52. Paris Saint-Germian speed demon Kylian Mbappe went toeto-toe with the Three Lions skipper as the two ended 2023 as the joint-best European goalscorers.

Of his 52 strikes, 42 came for Les Parisiens.

He bagged 34 league goals in 2023 en route to becoming the first player to win the Ligue 1 top-scorer award five times in a row in 2022/23 and moving top of the scoring leaderboard in 2023/24.

Manchester City's scoring machine Erling Braut Haaland was the only remaining player to book his place in the 50-goal club in the last calendar year. Haaland's remarkable maiden campaign in the Premier League entered the division's folklore, with the Norway international setting the new record for the highest number of goals scored in a single season.

The 23-year-old tallied 36 goals in 35 top-flight appearances and added 12 more in the Champions League in 2022/23 as Pep Guardiola's all-conquering side won a historic treble.

His numbers continue to grow. Despite missing the last couple of games through injury, Haaland is the league's jointtop scorer alongside Liverpool hero Mohamed Salah.
