

Fiji News Fiji is keen to learn from the experience and success of Mauritius sugar industry - Singh

Fiji is keen to learn from the experience and success of the Mauritius sugar industry, especially in areas of power co-generation, ethanol production and production of refined sugar. This was highlighted by the Minister for Sugar Industry Charan Jeet Singh during a courtesy visit to the President of the Republic of Mauritius Prithvirajsing Roopun, at the State House in Réduit, Mauritius. Singh relayed many similarities between the two countries that share historical traditions and cultures from the Girmit era where discussions revolved around reviving the sugar industry where challenges were common between the two countries. The minister says pressing issues affecting the sugar industry such as climate change and its impact, shortage of labor, aging growers, and lack of interest in cane farming by youths are some of the topics discussed in this meeting. Meanwhile, the President of Mauritius, commended Fiji's lead in advocating the impacts of climate change in the region emphasizing that small-state



developing countries, such as Fiji and Mauritius need to work together with other developing states to fight out carbon emissions and larger emitters. Singh also extended an invitation on behalf of the President to President Roopun to visit Fiji in the near future. After meeting with the President the Sugar Minister also met the Minister of Arts and Cultural Heritage Avinash Teeluck, in Port-Louis, Mauritius as the meeting surrounded matters on the Indentured Labour Route project, promotion of Bhojpuri and Hindi language, and the preservation of cultural and heritage sites. Mauritius and Fiji have common beliefs and traditions, and share many similarities in terms of their history and cultural heritage. The program of this visit to Mauritius also includes courtesy calls to the Offices of the Prime Minister of Mauritius, the Minister of Agro-Industry and Food Security, the Minister for Transport, Light Rail, Foreign Affairs, Regional Integration and International Trade. Singh will also make site visits to sugar industry institutions, sugar refineries and distilleries in Mauritius.

\$48.91 million paid out in compensation by ACCF since Jan 2018

\$48.91 million has been paid out in compensation under the no fault scheme by the Accident Compensation Commission of Fiji since 1st January 2018. \$32.66 million of this payout was for motor vehicle accidents, \$15.2 million for employment accidents and \$1.03 million for school accidents. The ACCF says 80 percent of the \$48.914 million would not have been paid if the applications for compensation were made prior to the introduction of the Accident Compensation Scheme. One of the recipients of the compensation expressed their appreciation to the ACCF for the decision to compensate their younger brother for the death of their nephew and son. A recipient lost their brother in a motor vehicle accident some years ago and they never received compensation because of the requirements at the time. Another recipient said her husband was the sol

bread winner for her family, she will invest half of the money received from ACCF and she will use the other half to fulfill his wish, that is to renovate and extend his family home. PRF has not secured any major co-funding in its first year of operation – PRF Founder

Pacific Recycling Foundation has not secured any major co-funding in its first year of operation and has mostly been supported by Waste Recyclers Fiji Limited through the assistance of some partners for its operational expenses. The Founder of PRF and CEO of Waste Recyclers Fiji Limited, Amitesh Deo highlighted this when fijivillage News asked him on how much funds the foundation has received in it's first year of operation, who provided the funds and how this has been utilised. Deo says Pacific Recycling Foundation is still very new and a number of programs and activities have been supported by its business arm, Waste Recyclers Fiji Limited (a private company). He says International Union for Conservation of Nature (IUCN), Swire Shipping, USAID, Women in Informal Employment: Globalizing and Organizing (WIEGO), UNDP, Pacific Energy, Tourism Fiji, Asco Motors, Kokomo Private Island Resort, Vinod Patel & Company Ltd and RC Ma-

Fiji News Ogea's Jimilai Store Stands the Test of Time

In 1971 a school teacher originally from Waciwaci, Lakeba was posted to the Matuatabu Primary School in Ogea, and along with him went his 19-year-old daughter Sulueti. Alas, for Sulueti that innocent jaunt to Ogea became a lifetime affair when she fell in love with Jimilai Kotobalavu (deceased) whom she describes as the only man that caught her eye. Fiftytwo years later, Sulueti still lives in her house in Ogea and operates a business they established in the late 1990s called Jimilai Store. According to Sulueti, running the business has been a testing ground for her. "We decided from the onset that we will use the business to develop our lives and our small family and we were successful all the way," she said. Now operating the island's only shop named after her late husband Jimilai, Sulueti has become a successful woman in business and a source of income for the Ogea villagers. "Our stock comes in on the franchise boats and this ensures that our shop is never out of stock at the same time we buy artifacts such as tanoas and resell them to a major business in Suva." "Apart from the island tanoas we also take in other artefacts like church gongs, the traditional Lali and these are marketed to handicraft outlets on the mainland," Sulueti said. Ogea Island has some of the largest forests of vesi trees (Intsia Bijuga) in the Lau Group and a big tree, of up to 50 metres height, with a highly buttressed trunk, has huge cultural significance. In Ogea, Sulueti said the tree has a regrowth rate

of four sprigs sprouting from the trunk of a felled tree and this has sustained the forests for many years till today. "This God-given gift has sustained us over the years and the products from Ogea and our neighbouring island have a standing of their own in Fiji." "But business is business and we buy these according to their sizes with set prices," she explained. At the age of 70, Sulueti not only runs her business but also manages the women's group on Ogea Island and has represented the group in a few women's expos held in Suva organised by the Ministry of Women. "One thing I always stressed to my fellow women here is to never fear venturing into business. I am just like them, a village

woman with not much education but management skills has to be very strict in such a village setting where everyone is related to you." "It is strictly business for me and one rule I live by is never to give credit which is one reason my business is still operating today." It was while attending the 2018 Women's Expo, that she got the news that her beloved husband had passed away back in the island. "I was distraught and missed out on the funeral as here on Ogea the deceased are buried the same day after confirmation by the health officials." "I came back to Ogea and for a while, the pain of losing my husband distracted me from the business but my son encouraged me to refocus and continue the legacy of



the full brunt of rising sea levels. Signs of this natural calamity has manifested itself with the village cricket pitch and village green now a pool of seawater with most of the village houses subjected to sea inundation at high tide.

"We remain hopeful that Government will hear our plea and that the recent visit by a government delegation led by the provincial administrator Lau, Iakobo Waqanidrola will be fruitful," Sulueti said. Ogea, with a population of 110 and 48 households, can be described as one of the remotest islands in the Lau Seascape. As one of the rockiest islands in the group, the only habitable spot has been occupied by the village. Mr Waqanidrola said while relocation was an option, other solutions will need to be explored to ensure the survival and habitability of Ogea village. "Of course, we will have to discuss this further with our senior management and find ways where we can work with our partners to alleviate the seawater inundation currently faced by Ogea villagers," Mr Waqanidrola said. However, he added that Ogea was not alone and the islands of Lau with their geographical location will need a 'whole of government' approach with the support of partners to address the issues they face especially the challenges brought about by climate change.

Ministry of Agriculture will work closely with FNU and resolve matters of vet graduates

With a number of Fiji National University graduates from the veterinary program calling for answers and solutions as they are still not registered to practice as vets, the Ministry of Agriculture has said in a statement that they will work closely with the FNU in resolving matters regarding the graduates. This is after FNU students who graduated with a Bachelors in Veterinary Science and Animal Husbandry program raised concerns as their 6 years of studies and hard work is not accredited and recognized in Fiji.

These students have also spent around \$40,000 to \$80,000 on their studies but still do not have a job as a practicing vet. Following a meeting between the two institutions, the resolutions collectively agreed to address the registration issue for graduates of the Bachelor of Veterinary Science and Animal Husbandry program. This includes the set-up of the veterinary council whereby the Ministry of Agriculture will review the current Veterinary Surgeons Acts, allow for the setting up of a Fiji Veterinary Council and will oversee the registration of qualified veterinarians enabling them to practice in Fiji. It is anticipated that this



process will take at least one year to complete. FNU also says the Ministry of Agriculture in consultation with Fiji Higher Education Commission and industry stakeholders, has noted gaps in the current Bachelor of Veterinary Science program and as such they have agreed on a registration pathway for the 55 graduates. They say under the pathway, to register as a practicing veterinarian in Fiji, the current graduates will have to go through a qualifying exam and a mandatory six-month internship either overseas or at local veterinary services and clinics.

The Ministry of Agriculture will also assist FNU in exploring funding opportunities from donors or sponsors for the internship. FNU will also advise graduates about the internship, qualifying examination and the registration of the graduates as vets will follow on from the qualifying exams. It is envisaged that graduates who may not pass the internship and qualifying exams may qualify as para-vets or assistant vets. Meanwhile, Minister for Agriculture, Vatimi Rayalu stressed that as a registration authority, the Ministry is responsible for upholding the veterinary standards to protect people, industry stakeholders, animal health and welfare, to maintain trust in veterinary professionals and that the Ministry is very much committed to the pathway and will work very closely with FNU to resolve the issue. FNU Acting Vice-Chancellor, Professor Unaisi Nabobo Baba says the university acknowledges the commitment by the Ministry in establishing a solutions-based and clear path forward.

World Scabies Program Fiji's MDA intervention to help reduce the spread of scabies

In a mission to reduce the percentage and prevent the spread of scabies in Fiji, the World Scabies Program (WSP) Organisation Fiji has taken the initiative of introducing the Mass Drug Administration (MDA). This involves giving treatment to an entire population or every person in a geographical area due to the high prevalence cases of certain diseases which means giving treatment to all eligible people whether they are infected or not. WSP Fiji Research Officer Aminiasi Koroi says there was 6.1 percent of the Fijian population that was infected with scabies before they conducted the MDA which is a surprising number for the organisation. He says with the intervention that they are currently conducting, they are trying to reduce the percentage to less than 2% which is the threshold that the World Health Organisation has guided any country around the world to eliminate scabies. Koroi says once they reach this target, there is a surety that it can be managed by the nurses in their settings. WSP Fiji Program Manager Aminiasi Tavui says this MDA intervention is very important because it will help in achieving the reduction target and also prevent the spread of this disease. He says this reduction target can only be achieved if people cooperate and participate in taking the 2 MDA doses. Tavui says the reason as to why there has to be

two doses is to totally eliminate the mites and its eggs present in the body.

He says after the first dose,

the mites that have matured will be eliminated but the eggs will still be present and after seven days, the eggs that will hatch and that is where the second dose comes in handy to clear them out of the body.



Ratu Sukuna changed the education system in Fiji and broke barriers – Dr. Ratuva

Ratu Sir Josefa Lalabalavu Vanayaliyali Sukuna changed education in Fiji to the efficient institution that we are now and it was one of his first and foremost focal points growing up as a young man. This was stated by award-winning political sociologist and global interdisciplinary scholar Doctor Steven Ratuva while elaborating on the life of Fiji's greatest statesman Ratu Sukuna at the University of the South Pacific. Dr. Ratuva says Ratu Sukuna was able to break through the barrier back in the day when a non-colonised person or an iTaukei was not allowed to have an education. He went on to pursue further education at Oxford University. He says Ratu Sukuna was also a reformist given the way he saw Fiji moving and also was a man of empathy. He adds Ratu Sukuna was perceived particularly by critics as somebody whose ideas inspired the nationalistic



ideas which led to some issues in the past like the 1987 and 2000 coups. Dr. Ratuva says some of the ideas that Ratu Sukuna came up with were misconceived by some people back in the day.

Dr. Ratuva says observing some of the public holidays this year, Ratu Sukuna Day being one of

them, is a symbolic gesture of diversity and unity in our country.

RFMF will not be pressing any charges against Ratu Tevita Mara for desertion - Commander

The Commander of the Republic of Fiji Military Forces, Major General Jone Kalouniwai states that the RFMF will not be pressing any charges against former senior military officer, Ratu Tevita Uluilakeba Mara for desertion. Major General Kalouniwai says with the growing interest in the recent return of Ratu Tevita back into the country, there has been a lot of hype surrounding the possibility of him facing a General Court Martial due to claims that he was a Deserter, contrary to section 37 (2) (a) of the Army Act 1955. The Army Commander says the RFMF wishes to advise that Ratu Tevita Mara applied for his resignation of Commission and discharge from the RFMF on the 29th of March 2011. This was approved by the Commander of the RFMF on the 31st of March 2011 and subsequently gazetted on the 20th of May 2011. Major

General Kalouniwai says this effectively meant that Ratu Tevita was no longer a member of the RFMF, hence no longer subjected to military law from 31st March 2011 onwards. The Commander says Ratu Tevita absconded Fiji on 9th May 2011 while facing a sedition charge from the State in the Magistrates Court. Meanwhile Assistant Director of Public Prosecutions, Lee Burney, has already decided that there will be no reinstatement of charges against Ratu Tevita following a review of the matter. The Assistant DPP says following a review of the police file and the evidence, there was insufficient evidence to support any criminal charges. The docket has been returned to police with the instructions that Ratu Tevita's name be removed from the watch list and no further action is required.



WAIDAMUDAMU FARMERS IN VUNIMOLI LABASA BOOSTED WITH A TRACTOR

Coronavirus: Australian garlic kills COVID and flu with '99.9 percent efficacy,' new study finds

Garlic is known to be good for killing bacteria and has long been used in traditional Chinese medicine. A world-first study reportedly shows certain Australian garlic varieties can kill COVID-19 and the common flu with "99.9 percent efficacy." The new research was released on Wednesday by The Peter Doherty Institute, reported The Australian Financial Review. Scientists at Doherty have been researching garlic properties over the past 18 months. They found that a certain Australian grown garlic variety has antiviral properties with up to 99.9 per cent efficacy against SARS-CoV-2 and Influenza type A viruses. The research involved in-vitro testing against the SARS-CoV-2 and Influenza type A viruses using garlic ingredients extracted from exclusive Australian grown garlic varieties. "We wanted to know if these strains had the possibility of killing COVID-19," Dr. Julie McAuley, manager of the

Doherty's high containment facility COVID-19 research lab. told The Australian Financial Review. "I thought it might fail miserably. We blindly tested over 20 varieties. We found one of AGP's products could reduce the infectious titre of SARS-CoV-2 and influenza by 3-log-fold (99.9 per cent). We barely detected any remaining virus genome, indicating nearly complete virucidal activity." Dr McAuley said the variety was tested across different sites to ensure the results were not related to the environment, nutrients, water or any other factors.Stringent clinical trials are required to determine if the findings of this research translates from test tubes to humans, said the Doherty Institute. Epidemiologist at the University of Wollongong Gideon Meyerowitz-Katz added, "We won't know if this product helps with COVID-19 or influenza until we run clinical trials in real people, rather than petri dishes in a lab." The most



efficacious garlic varieties and their extracted proprietary garlic ingredients are being commercialized, as per reports. They will be available for consumption as a soft capsule supplement and are subject to a recently lodged International Patent. Paul Guerra, chief executive of the Victorian Chamber of Commerce and Industry, hosting the launch of the research on Wednesday, said the discovery could be a big change and be exported to the world.

Why might these three dietary factors increase your risk? Whole grains are high in fiber, vitamins, and minerals which help regulate blood sugar levels. Refined rice and wheat are typically found in processed foods and contain a high glycemic index, which raises blood sugar levels. When foods with refined rice and wheat are consumed in excess, it can lead to insulin resistance. "Refined carbs like white rice are digested quickly, causing spikes in blood sugar,' Aubrey Redd, MS, RDN, LDN, who was not involved in the research, told Healthline. "Since your HbA1c is a measure of your average blood sugar over the past 3 months, significant spikes can raise the overall average." A growing amount of evidence links an unhealthy diet with the risk of developing type 2 diabetes Andrew Odegaard, associate professor of epidemiology & biostatistics, at the University of California, Irvine, Program in Public

Health, explained that this latest study is part of a growing body of evidence that demonstrates habitual, high intake of refined grain foods can have acute impacts on physiologic and metabolic parameters, which can lead to a higher risk of type 2 diabetes. "Whole grains largely have a beneficial effect relative to refined grains physiologically and metabolically. There is more circumstantial evidence relating the effects of habitual processed meat intake with type 2 diabetes," Odegaard stated. "I would best summarize this as there are plausible mechanisms, but still work to do, and probably best to invoke the precautionary principle if one is concerned with type 2 diabetes risk that could result from high and frequent consumption of processed meats," he added. Healthy food alternatives that can help lower your type 2 diabetes risk Odegaard suggested that if you're concerned about your risk of developing type 2 diabetes, try eating more of the following foods in place of refined grains: fruits vegetables legumes "Simplistically, there is evidence for lower type 2 diabetes risk when eating intact whole grains instead of refined grains," Odgaard said. Additionally, Redd pointed out that swapping "refined grains with whole grains" will provide you with "added fiber, and fewer blood sugar spikes." "Fiber slows down digestion and releases sugar slowly in

the blood, unlike their refined counterparts," Redd explained. Additionally, Odegaard suggested that eating lean sources of protein (non-red meat) can also make a big difference. These include: fish cheese tofu eggs beans Takeaway According to a new research model, poor diet is linked to over 14.1 million cases of type 2 diabetes in 2018, based on data from 1990 to 2018. Three dietary factors played the biggest role in type 2 diabetes risk: insufficient consumption of whole grains, eating too much refined rice and wheat, and excess intake of processed meat. For healthy food alternatives, try lean sources of protein (nonred meat) such as fish, cheese, tofu, eggs and beans. Also, swap refined grains for whole grains. Processed meat contains additives and sodium, which could contribute to poor metabolic health by driving inflammation.

Taking a Daily Multivitamin May Protect Your Memory Later in Life

A daily multivitamin or multimineral supplement improved memory in older adults over a three-year period, a new study shows. If supported by future research, the findings could provide an easy and inexpensive way to slow age-related memory decline, according to researchers. In the study, which, involved more than 3,500 adults over age 60, researchers randomly assigned participants to take a daily multivitamin supplement or an inactive placebo for three years. At the start of the study and at the end of each year, participants took an online cognitive test at home to assess their short-term memory. By the end of the first year, both groups saw improvements in memory, but the group taking a daily multivitamin saw a larger improvement. The researchers estimate that the changes in the multivitamin group, which were sustained over the three years of the study, were equivalent to about three years of age-related memory decline. Still, that improvement was modest and the data does not account for the long term. "You basically had stabilization of memory, where you held off cognitive decline across that three-year time period," Dr. Thomas Holland, a physician scientist in the Division of Digestive Diseases and Nutrition at RUSH University in Chicago, who was not involved in the study, told Healthline. The new study is part of a large clinical trial called the COcoa Supplement and Multivitamin Outcomes Study (COSMOS). More research on cognitive benefits of multivitamins needed Taking a daily multivitamin did not appear to improve other types of brain function such as memory retention, novel object recognition, and executive function — the ability to plan, focus and juggle multiple tasks. One limitation of the study is that the majority of participants were white and more highly educated. So the results may not apply to other groups. "I'd feel more comfortable if these results were replicated in a more generalizable cohort," Mark A. Espeland, PhD, professor of gerontology



and geriatric medicine at Wake Forest University School of Medicine in Winston-Salem, North Carolina, told Healthline. The authors of the study point out that the memory improvements experienced by the multivitamin group are small, so may not be noticed by people. However, "even small effect sizes can result in large health benefits at the population level," they wrote. Also, a daily multivitamin is relatively inexpensive, they added, and could be taken by most people. How multivitamins may boost brain health Espeland said the results are consistent with the findings of a separate COSMOS study, published in 2022, which he was involved with. In that study, which involved more than 2,200 older adults, he and his colleagues found that people who took a daily multivitamin saw an improvement in their overall cognition, memory and executive function. As with the new study, the effect was stronger in people with cardiovascular disease, which is a risk factor for dementia. In a separate paper from the COS-MOS study, published earlier this year, Espeland and his colleagues also found that a daily multivitamin appeared to help people who developed dementia during the study. "Among those people who did transition from mild cognitive impairment to dementia, if they were using multivitamins, the drop [in overall cognition and executive function] seemed to be less," he told Healthline. "This potentially indicates that these multivitamins might provide benefits even for people with [cognitive] disease," he added. Espeland cautions that additional studies are needed before widely recommending a daily multivitamin for older adults, especially since other research has found no benefit of a daily multivitamin on cognitive outcomes. Healthy diet may benefit cognitive function Many factors influence memory and other cognitive abilities. A key one is diet. In the new study, researchers assessed people's dietary patterns at the beginning - both groups were similar to the average American diet . As a result, they don't believe that diet affected the average memory changes seen in either group. Some clinical trials have shown that dietary interventions can improve memory. For example, the MIND diet, which was developed by researchers at RUSH University, has been linked to better cognitive performance in older adults. This diet is a

hybrid of the Mediterranean and DASH (Dietary Approaches to Stop Hypertension) diets. Holland said he expects that dietary interventions such as the MIND diet would have a bigger impact on cognition than multivitamins. However, there may still be a role for taking a pill every day, he added, especially given the high cost of fresh fish, berries and other nutrient-dense foods. "In a multivitamin, you're not going to have the same quantity and quality of vitamins and minerals that you would in a broad nutritious diet," he said, "but you are bridging the gap of some of those potential [micronutrient] deficiencies." In addition, "if you're not going to change your diet, bridging with a supplement is not a bad idea," he said. He also emphasized that a healthy diet is only one way to reduce your risk of age-related cognitive problems. It's important to also have "physical activity, socialization, cognitive activities, and quantity and quality of sleep," he said. Benefits for people with heart disease The effect of a daily multivitamin on memory in the study appeared stronger in people with cardiovascular disease, researchers found. These people started the study with worse memory performance,

but after one year of taking the multivitamin, their memory was similar to those without heart disease. This suggests that the multivitamin is filling nutrient gaps in a person's diet, the authors say. Other research has found that some people with cardiovascular disease may have deficiencies in certain micronutrients. The results show average changes, so some people taking a daily multivitamin saw greater improvements in memory, and others less. Takeaway New research shows a modest short-term cognitive benefit of taking a daily multivitamin and subjects with heart disease who took a daily vitamin saw the greatest improvements in memory. More rigorous studies are needed to determine whether multivitamin use has any impact on cognitive function over the long term. Multivitamins may offer general health benefits when taken in conjunction with a healthy, balanced diet. When considering multivitamins, remember that dietary supplements are not approved by the Food and Drug Administration (FDA) for safety or effectiveness. Ask your healthcare team about adding a daily multivitamin to your health regimen to determine whether it's right for you.





The shape of your brain may strongly influence your thoughts and behavior, study finds

Though much about the brain remains a mystery, scientists have long surmised that our thoughts, feelings and behavior are the result of billions of interconnected neurons that transmit signals to each other, thereby enabling communication between regions of the brain. But a study published Wednesday in the journal Nature challenges that idea, suggesting instead that the shape of the brain — its size, curves and grooves — may exert a greater influence on how we think, feel and behave than the connections and signals between neurons. A research team in Australia arrived at that conclusion after taking MRI scans of 255 people's brains while the participants performed tasks like tapping their fingers or recalling a sequence of images. From there, the team examined 10,000 different maps of people's brain activity, gathered from more than 1,000 experiments worldwide, to further assess the role of brain shape. Next, they created a computer model that simulated the way a brain's size and shape affect waves of electrical activity, better known as brain wayes. They compared that model to a pre-existing computer model of brain activity that closely



aligns with the understanding of neuron connectivity as the driver of brain function. The comparison showed that the new model provided a more accurate reconstruction of the brain activity shown in the MRI scans and brain activity maps than the prior model. James Pang, the study's lead author and a research fellow at Monash University in Australia, likened the significance of brain shape to a pebble making ripples in a pond: The size and shape of the pond helps determine the nature of those ripples. "The geometry is pretty important because it guides how the wave would look, which in turn relates to the activity patterns that you



see when people perform different tasks," Pang said.David Van Essen, a neuroscience professor at Washington University in St. Louis, said the brain shape theory has been floated for more than a decade. But most researchers, he said, still subscribe to the classical hypothesis: that each of the brain's nearly 100 billion neurons, or nerve cells, has an axon, which functions like a wire to carry information to other neurons, and that enables brain activity. "The fundamental starting hypothesis is that the wiring of the brain is central to understanding how the brain functions," Van Essen said. Pang said his research doesn't discount the significance of communication between neurons; rather, it suggests that the geometry of the brain plays a more essential role in brain function. "What the work is showing is that the shape has a stronger influence, but it's not saying that connectivity is not important," he said. Pang also noted that the brain shape hypothesis comes with an advantage: Brain shape is easier to measure than brain wiring, so paying closer attention to the size or curves of the brain could open new avenues for research.

Marijuana Users More Likely to Develop Peripheral Artery Disease

Smoking cigarettes has long been known to be a risk factor for peripheral artery disease (PAD), a condition where the buildup of fatty plaque in the arteries limits blood flow to the legs or arms. But a new study suggests that cannabis users may also have a higher risk of developing PAD, compared to the general population. Even younger adults are at risk, the results show. In the United States, 6.5 million people age 40 and older have PAD, reports the Centers for Disease Control and Prevention. With over 48 million Americans using cannabis at least once in 2019, and cannabis use on the rise among younger adults, the authors of the new study say cannabis users should be aware of the symptoms of this condition. One well-known symptom of PAD is pain, aches or cramps in the leg, hip or buttock while walking or doing other physical activity, with relief upon rest. Other signs in the leg that may indicate PAD include muscle weakness, hair loss, smooth and shiny skin, sores or ulcers that don't heal, and cold or numb toes. The new study was presented May 17 at the annual meeting of the Society for Cardiovascular Angiography & Interventions, in Phoenix, Ariz. Findings presented at scientific meetings should be considered preliminary until published in a peer-reviewed journal. Higher risk of PAD with cannabis use In the study, researchers examined data from 2016 to 2019 on over 623,000 hospital patients who were diagnosed as cannabis users. Patients were 38 years of age on average, with around the same percentage of men and women. The majority of patients were white. Of these patients, around 2,400 were diagnosed with PAD — less than one percent. Marijuana users had more than three times the risk of being diagnosed with PAD, compared to the general population. However, they did not have an increased risk of dying or requiring a procedure to open a clogged artery. In light of these results, "patients

and physicians both need to be aware that there is some association here [between cannabis use and PAD]," study author Dr. Hirva Vyas from Hackensack University Medical Center in New Jersey, told Healthline. One particularly concerning aspect of the results, she said, is that patients were younger. PAD more commonly occurs in people 60 years or older, especially in those with other risk factors such as: smoking high blood pressure atherosclerosis diabetes high cholesterol If younger adults "have pain in their legs while walking, they may attribute it to something else, like a muscle ache or sprain," said of any age - have symptoms that could be PAD, it would be worthwhile to see a doctor, she added. Cannabis linked to other health problems Because of the way the study was designed, it cannot show a cause-and-effect link between cannabis use and PAD. However, Dr. Michael Go, who specializes in vascular surgery at The Ohio State University Wexner Medical Center in Columbus, Ohio, said cannabis use has been associated for some time with cardiovascular problems. For example, one study found that young adults who reported recent cannabis use were more likely to have had a heart attack. Dr. Claudia Martinez-Bermudez, a cardiologist and associate professor at UHealth, the University of Miami Health System, who was not involved in the new study, also pointed to a 2020 American Heart Association statement, which reviews the potential risks of medicinal and recreational cannabis, including cardiovascular ones. In the new study, researchers did not have information on which types of cannabis products people used. So the study can't show whether the increased risk of PAD was related to smoking plant cannabis or from using gummies, , or other edibles. Martinez-Bermudez said more research is needed about cannabis composition in relation to PAD, because some products "may be more harmful - and



others not - depending on the THC/CBD [cannabidiol] composition," she told Healthline. In addition, more information is needed on how people who develop PAD have been using cannabis. "Cannabis can be used in many ways including smoking and in combination with tobacco," said Martinez-Bermudez, "all of which could contribute to peripheral vascular disease." PAD link less well studied Go, who was not involved in the new study, pointed out that the link between cannabis and PAD has been less studied than other types of cardiovascular problems. However, "there have been a handful of articles over

the last ten years showing that cannabis use may be related to several forms of PAD," he said. One study found that cannabis use disorder is linked to a sudden decrease in blood flow to the limbs. Another showed that cannabis users had a higher risk of inflammation of the arteries in the lower limbs. "All these conditions come with higher risks of amputation," Go told Healthline. With limited research to date, scientists are not certain how cannabis use may increase the risk of PAD. The authors of the new paper suggest that cannabis may affect how blood clots form or how blood vessels function. "It

is also unclear if it is the THC [delta-9-tetrahydrocannabinol] itself or other components of smoke inhalation" that increases the risk of PAD, said Go. While cannabis users in the new study did not have a higher risk of dying or requiring a procedure to open a clogged artery, Go cautioned that it's still too soon to know whether or not cannabis use results in severe PAD. In the meantime, he recommends that people at higher risk of PAD use cannabis in moderation. In addition, "doctors should ask patients about cannabis use, and consider it to be an additional risk factor for PAD in their patients," he said.



Belgorod: Russia blames Ukraine for shelling inside border

The Russian region of Belgorod has again come under attack from across the Ukrainian border, with at least eight people reportedly hurt in shelling. Russia's defence ministry has also claimed it thwarted other attempts by Ukraine to "invade" the region. Kyiv has not commented on the allegations but has denied involvement in previous attacks across the border. The latest strikes come more than a week after one of the most significant cross-border raids since the war began. Belgorod's governor, Vyacheslav Gladkov, said Ukraine's armed forces shelled several districts on Thursday, damaging buildings. No fatalities have been reported but Mr Gladkov said hundreds of families would be evacuated once the situation became calmer. Mr Gladkov added that as a result, some school exams in Shebekino had been cancelled and the authorities were now devising a way to allow students to secure university places without sitting them. He also said that there had been an explosion in Belgorod city, which was thought to have been caused by a drone. Two people were injured in that attack. Alongside the shelling, Russia's defence ministry has claimed its servicemen in the region repelled several attacks. It said in a state-



ment on Thursday evening that more than 50 Ukrainian "terrorists", four armoured combat vehicles, a Grad multiple rocket launcher and a pickup truck were destroyed. It has not been possible to independently verify the reports. There have been conflicting reports about violence on the border. BBC Verify has seen videos from two pro-Ukrainian paramilitary groups, the Freedom of Russia Legion and the Russian Volunteer Corps, announcing raids into Russia's territory.Despite

this, local officials have denied reports of a Ukrainian troop breakthrough in Shebekino adding that the situation remains difficult and that the "shelling is ongoing". Kremlin spokesman Dmitry Peskov said Russian President Vladimir Putin was aware of the situation in Belgorod and criticised the international committee for failing to condemn Ukraine. There have been a spate of attacks inside Russia in recent weeks. Earlier this week, Russian President Vladimir Putin accused

Ukraine of trying to frighten Russians following drone attacks in the capital, Moscow. Kyiv has denied involvement in any of the attacks. But the US is investigating whether any of its military equipment was used in the earlier incursion in Belgorod on 22 May and said it did not support any attack on Russian soil. Meanwhile, three people have died during another attack on Ukraine's capital, Kyiv. An 11-year-old girl is reported to be among the dead. It is the fourth attack on the city

this week and comes after 17 strikes were launched on Kyiv throughout May. It comes as the country's president, Volodymyr Zelensky, again called for Ukraine to be allowed to join Nato and the EU. He was visiting Moldova for the European Political Community summit, where he also met European Commission President Ursula von Der Leyen. He said their talks touched on security guarantees for Ukraine while it's waiting to join Nato.

World News China launches first spaceship with civilian

China on Tuesday successfully launched the Shenzhou-16 manned spaceship, sending three astronauts, including the first civilian to its space station combination for a five-month mission. The spaceship, atop a Long March-2F carrier rocket, blasted off from the Jiuquan Satellite Launch Centre in northwest China at 9:31 AM (Beijing Time), according to the China Manned Space Agency (CMSA). About 10 minutes after the launch, Shenzhou-16 separated from the rocket and entered its designated orbit. The crew members are in good shape and the launch is a complete success, the CMSA declared, it said. The astronauts are expected to dock with the station's Tianhe core module about 400km above the ground – after a journey of less than seven hours. For the first time, China has included a civilian in its rotating crew for the space station which otherwise remained a domain of the military personnel. Gui Haichao, a professor at Beihang University in Beijing regarded as a payload specialist was among the three astronauts. The other two are mission's commander Jing Haipeng, who is also making history by becoming the first Chinese astronaut to go into space for a record fourth time. The astronaut



flight engineer Zhu Yangzhu is also making his first journey into space. The Shenzhou-16 will be the first crew mission after China's space station programme entered the stage of application and development, Lin Xiqiang, deputy director of the CMSA told the media on Monday.The trio will stay in orbit for about five months, he said. Once ready, China will be the only country to own a space station as the International Space Station (ISS) of Russia is a collaborative project of several countries. The ISS station is also set to be decommissioned by 2030. The significant feature of China's space station is its two robotic arms, especially the long one which has the ability to grab objects, including satellites from space. After entering orbit, the Shenzhou-16 spaceship will make a fast, automated rendezvous and docking with the space station combination.

Jasmine Hartin: Socialite spared jail after killing Belize police chief

A Canadian socialite who killed a police chief in Belize with his own gun has reportedly been spared prison time. Jasmine Hartin, 34, was handed a £30,000 fine and 300 hours of community service, according to local reports. She pleaded guilty in April to the manslaughter of Henry Jemmott on 28 May 2021. He died from a single gunshot wound to the head. Hartin is the former partner of Andrew Ashcroft, the son of a prominent UK businessman Lord Michael Ashcroft. Under the sentence handed down by the Belize's high court, Hartin must pay \$75,000 BZD within 12 months, or face a potential prison sentence of 12 months,

according to Channel 5 Belize. She must also produce a video warning against the dangers of drunkenness and mishandling firearms, according to Breaking Belize News. At the time of Mr Jemmott's death. Hartin and Mr Ashcroft lived in Belize with their two children. Over the course of the investigation and criminal trial, it was revealed that Hartin and Mr Jemmott, who were known to be friends, had been at a party in together on the island of Ambergris Caye on the night of his death. Police say that the two took a stroll on the beach before ending up at a pier. At some point, Mr Jemmott handed her his gun to put aside. She later told investigators that

she had been drinking, and had fumbled with the Glock 17 after the police chief asked for it back, leading to an accidental discharge. Police found Hartin near the pier, covered in blood and distraught. Mr Jemmott's body was found in the water off San Pedro, Belize. Hartin was charged with manslaughter by negligence, and eventually pleaded guilty in April 2023. Under Belize's criminal code, the maximum prison sentence for manslaughter by negligence is five years. After she pleaded guilty, Hartin told reporters outside court: "I just want Henry's family to have peace now and I want this whole thing to be behind all of us so we can heal."

Russia says drones damage Moscow buildings in pre-dawn attack, blames Ukraine



Russian air defences stopped eight drones converging on Moscow, officials said Tuesday, in an attack that authorities blamed on Ukraine, while Russia pursued its relentless bombardment of Kyiv with a third assault on the city in 24 hours. The Russian defence ministry said five drones were shot down and the systems of three others were jammed, causing them to veer off course. It called the incident a "terrorist attack" by the "Kyiv regime." The attack caused "insignificant damage" to several buildings, Moscow Mayor Sergei Sobyanin said. Two people received medical attention for unspecified injuries but did not need hospitalisation, he said in a Telegram post. Residents of two high-rise buildings damaged in the attack were evacuated, Sobyanin said. Andrei Vorobyov, governor of the wider Moscow region, said some of the drones were "shot down on the approach to Moscow." Ukraine made no immediate comment on the attack, which would be one of its deepest and most daring strikes into Russia since the Kremlin launched its full-scale invasion of Ukraine more than 15 months ago. The attacks have raised questions about the effectiveness of Russia's air defence systems. A senior Russian lawmaker, Andrei Kartapolov, told Russian business news site RBC that "we have a very big country and there will always be a loophole where the drone can fly around the areas where air defense systems are located." Kartapolov said the purpose of the attacks was to unnerve the Russian people. "It's an intimidation act aimed at the civilian population," RBC quoted him as saying. "It's designed to create a wave of panic." Moscow residents reported hearing explosions before dawn. Police were seen working at one site of a crashed drone in southwest Moscow. An area near a residential building was fenced off, and police put the drone debris in a cardboard box before carrying it away. At another site, apartment windows were shattered and there were scorch marks on the building's front. It was the second reported attack on Moscow. Russian authorities said

two drones targeted the Kremlin earlier this month in what they portrayed as an attempt on President Vladimir Putin's life. Ukrainian drones have reportedly flown deep into Russia several times. In December, Russia claimed it had shot down drones at airfields in the Saratov and Ryazan regions. Three soldiers were reported killed in the attack in Saratov, which targeted an important military airfield. Earlier, Russia reported shooting down a Ukrainian drone that targeted the headquarters of its Black Sea Fleet in Sevastopol in Russia-annexed Crimea. In Ukraine, Russia launched a predawn air raid on Kyiv, killing at least one person and sending the capital's residents again scrambling into shelters. At least 20 Shahed explosive drones were destroyed by air defence forces in Kyiv's airspace in Russia's third attack on the capital in the past 24 hours, according to early information from the Kyiv Military Administration. Overall, Ukraine shot down 29 of 31 drones fired into the country, most in the Kyiv area, the air force later added. Before

daylight, the buzzing of drones could be heard over the city, followed by loud explosions as they were taken down by air defense systems. In the overnight attacks on Kyiv, one person died and seven were injured, according to the municipal military administration. A high-rise building in the Holosiiv district caught fire after being hit by debris either from from drones being hit or interceptor missiles. The building's upper two floors were destroyed, and there may be people under the rubble, the Kyiv Military Administration said. More than 20 people were evacuated. Resident Valeriya Oreshko told The Associated Press in the aftermath that even though the immediate threat was over, the attacks had everyone on edge. "You are happy that you are alive, but think about what will happen next," the 39-yearold said. A resident who gave only her first name, Oksana, said the whole building shook when it was hit. "Go to shelters, because you really do not know where it (the drone) will fly," she advised others. "We hold on." Elsewhere in the capital, falling debris caused a fire in a private house in Darnytskyi district and three cars were set alight in Pechersky district, according to the military administration. The series of attacks that began Sunday included a rare daylight attack Monday that left puffs of white smoke in the blue skies. On that day, Russian forces fired 11 ballistic and cruise missiles at Kyiv at about 11:30 a.M., according to Ukraine's chief of staff, Valerii Zaluzhnyi. All of them were shot down, he said. Debris from intercepted missiles fell in Kyiv's central and northern districts during the morning, landing in the middle of traffic on a city road and also starting a fire on the roof of a building, the Kyiv military administration said. At least one civilian was reported hurt. The Russian Defence Ministry said it launched a series of strikes early Monday targeting Ukrainian air bases with precision long-range air-launched missiles. It claimed the strikes destroyed command posts, radars, aircraft and ammunition stockpiles, but didn't say anything about hitting cities or other civilian areas.



- 2. Allow the water to return to a rolling boil and cook the peas for 3 minutes. Remove

- the pan from heat, strain the peas and reserve about a cup of the boiling water.3. Rinse the peas under run
 - ning cold water and let them drain. In a blender, place the peas,






