Indian Global Diaspora Celebrate **Rishi Sunak's PM Victory**



Greetings poured in from throughout the global Indian society as Rishi Sunak became the first Indian-origin politician to take the oath of office as UK prime minister. Sunak's parents are of Indian origin, having moved to East Africa from Punjab (present-day Gujranwala, Pakistan) in 1935 and later to the UK in the 1960s. His father practiced general medicine, while his mother ran a pharmacy. Sunak, 42, is one of the wealthiest people in the UK, with a net worth of more than

£700 million (\$803 million). His father-in-law Narayana Murthy is an Indian business mogul and the owner of the technology firm Infosys.

He is also the UK's first Hindu prime minister from the Conservative Party. Despite the fact that he is a practicing Hindu and that videos of him praying at temples have been widely circulated on social media in India, he has avoided discussing his religion. Sunak succeeded Liz Truss, the UK's shortest-serving prime minister, who served for

only 44 days. Indian lawmakers and members of the public expressed their excitement at his appointment on social media.

Sunak was congratulated by Indian Prime Minister Narendra Modi. In a tweet, he stated, "Warmest congratulations @ RishiSunak! As you become UK PM, I look forward to working closely together on global issues, and implementing Roadmap 2030. Special Diwali wishes to the 'living bridge' of UK Indians, as we transform our historic ties into a modern

partnership."

At just 42, Rishi Sunak is the youngest prime minister in modern times - taking the record held by his old boss David Cameron, who was 43 when appointed. His appointment as PM came on the day millions celebrated Diwali, and as a practicing Hindu, he has said one of his proudest career moments was lighting ceremonial divas (oil lamps) outside 11 Downing Street while chancellor. A traditional Hindu red bracelet, meant for good luck and protection, could be seen on his wrist when he posed on the steps of 10 Downing Street for the first time as UK leader. PM Sunak joins other World Leaders of Indian origins like US Vice President Kamala Harris, Pravind Kumar Jugnauth who was elected the Prime Minister of Mauritius after holding a number of major positions in the cabinet, and Antonio Costa, the current prime minister of Portugal and who is half Portuguese and half Goan.

ment for pacifica generations wanting to pursue extended opportunities through the sport of rugby–further announcing his significant donation.



Rishi Sunak's wife is richer than the Queen: Tech billionaire's daughter who he met while studying at Stanford has shares in family's firm are worth £430million - making her one of Britain's wealthiest women



Chancellor Rishi Sunak's wife Akshata Murthy (pictured together at their wedding) has shares in her family's tech business worth £430million, making her richer than the Queen

Rishi Sunak's wife has shares in her family's tech firm that are worth £430million, making her one of Britain's wealthiest women, it has been revealed. Akshata Murthy and her relatives hold a multimillion pound portfolio of shareholdings which have come to light amid questions over the Chancellor, who met his future wife while studying at Stanford University, California, failing to declare them in the register of ministers' interests. The assets make Indian-born Akshata richer than the Queen, who is estimated to be worth £350million, according to the Sunday Times Rich List. She is the daughter of one of the richest men in India - billionaire N. R. Narayana Murthy - who has been described as the father of the Indian IT sector and 'one of the 12 greatest businessmen of all time'.

Sunak is the son of a GP father and pharmacist mother who emigrated to Southampton from East Africa in the 1960s, and he studied at Oxford University before winning a Fulbright scholarship to Stanford where the future husband and wife met.

The latest revelation comes after Sunak faced demands to reveal details of his financial interests last month, after it emerged he set up a 'blind trust' when he was made Chief Secretary to the Treasury in July last year. But critics said there was still risk of conflict as Sunak - reputed to be the richest MP - is aware what he put into the trust. Sunak's wife is the daughter of an entrepreneur in India, co-founding technology company Infosys - in which she owns 0.91 per cent shares, totalling £430million.

Her family are also have a joint venture with Amazon worth £900million a year and shares in the firm running Jamie Oliver's Jamie's Italian and burger chain Wendy's in India. Before becoming Chancellor, Sunak was better known in India than he was in Britain, after he became a household name when he married Akshata, the daughter of a self-made billionaire.

Akshata's father is the 51st richest man in India and ranks at 1135 in the world's billionaire list, according to Forbes. The father-of-two from Bangalore, India, graduated with a science Master's degree from the Indian Institute of Technology before becoming the co-founder and chairman of Infosys. He spent 30 years at the company before resigning in 2011, coming back in 2013 to pass the management to a CEO in 2014.

The tech giant was worth around £2billion when Southampton-born Sunak travelled on a Fulbright scholarship to Stanford University in California, where he met his future wife after taking Philosophy, Politics and Economics at Oxford. It is today valued at around £33.3billion, with Mr Murphy's real-time net worth estimated at around £2.3billion (\$3.1bn) at the time of writing.

According to his company profile, Mr Murthy, whose wife, Sudha, works as an author, is currently on the boards of Ford Foundation, the Institute for Advanced Study in New Jersey and the United Nations Foundation.

He has also served on the boards of Cornell University, Wharton School, the Graduate School of Business at Stanford University and the Rhodes Trust at Oxford, alongside Yale University's international advisory board.On its website, Infosys says that Mr Murthy 'introduced the concept of the 24-hour work day to the world'.

It states: 'Mr Murthy conceptualized, articulated and implemented the Global Delivery Model (GDM) which has become the backbone of the Indian software industry.

'GDM is based on collaborative distributed software development principles and has resulted in the delivery of superior quality software to global customers delivered on time and within budget. Mr Murthy also introduced the concept of the 24-hour work day to the world. 'Under Mr. Murthy's leadership. Infosys became the leader in innovation in technical, managerial and leadership training, software technology, quality, productivity, customer focus, employee satisfaction, and physical and technological infrastructure.' Sunak and Akshata married in 2009 in her home city of Bangalore in a two-day ceremony attended by 1,000 guests.

Before entering politics, Mr Sunak, who is now a multimillionaire in his own right, studied at the £42,000-per-year Winchester College and later at Oxford University.

During his time in business, he worked in California, India and Britain for various investment firms including Goldman Sachs. He later set up his own business, Theleme Partners, in 2010 with an initial fund of £536million.

While building the hedge fund he spent a couple of days doing voluntary work for the Conservatives – which was when he decided he would like to go into politics full-time.

Speaking about his decision to go into politics, he once explained: 'It was my parents who motivated me, but not in a political way. 'My dad was a GP, my mum a pharmacist, and I grew up working in their surgery; in the pharmacy; delivering medicines to people who couldn't pick them up. 'People would always stop and talk to me about my mum and dad, saying, 'Oh, you're Mrs Sunak's son, Dr Sunak's son.' And then they'd have some story about how my parents had helped them, or their parents, or children, and I thought that was amazing.

'They had done the same job in the same place for 30 years, and it was clear that they as individuals were able to have an amazing impact on the community around us, and that I found pretty inspiring. And that was my motivation for becoming an MP.'

Every year Sunak and his wife throw a summer garden party for local villagers at their magnificent Georgian £1.5million manor house in Kirby Sigston, just outside Northallerton, Yorkshire - leading to him being dubbed the 'Maharaja of the Dales'.

Sir Alistair Graham, a former chairman of the committee on standards in public life, said the Chancellor appeared to have 'taken the most minimalist approach possible' to divulging information. He told The Guardian: 'Perhaps Rishi Sunak should carefully read the "Seven principles of Public Life" to make sure he is fulfilling the two principles of "Honesty and Leadership".' But a Treasury spokesman said Mr Sunak had 'followed the ministerial code to the letter in his declaration of interests'. It follows Mr Sunak facing demands to reveal details of his financial interests last month, after it emerged he set up a 'blind trust' on becoming a minister. The Chancellor deployed the arrangement, meaning that he does not know how his assets are being invested, when he was made Chief Secretary to the Treasury in July last year.

But critics said there was still risk of conflict as Mr Sunak reputed to be the richest MP - is aware what he put into the trust. It also means he does not have to disclose fuller details of his investment portfolio. The presence of the trust was revealed in the latest register of ministerial interests.

It came as other official documents revealed that he did not take his salary for five months when he joined the Treasury last year. He waived the £34,000 top up to his MP's salary until just before Christmas. Theresa May also attracted controversy as she made a similar move when she became Prime Minister in 2016. And in the mid-1990s the Tories attacked Tony Blair as it emerged he used a blind trust, when leader of the opposition, to fund his office. Former standards tsar Sir Alex Allan, who quit his role last week after Boris Johnson overruled his conclusion that the Home Secretary Priti Patel breached the ministerial code, is said to have signed off on Sunak's disclosures.

Fiji News Fiji Ready for Elections Polls in December 2022

Fijians will now go to the Polls on 14th December 2022 after Fijian President His Excellency, Ratu Wiliame Katonivere issued the Writ for General Elections 2022 to the Chair of the Electoral Commission, Mukesh Nand, at the State House on Monday 31st October 2022. While issuing the Writ, President Katonivere directed that the nominations of candidates must be received at the Fijian Elections Office by 12pm on November 14th. He also commanded the Electoral Commission to endorse the names of candidates who have been elected as Members of Parliament and for the Writ to be returned on or before December 28th, 2022.

"Whereas by virtue of the Constitution of the Republic of Fiji, it has become necessary to hold an election on members to sit and vote in Parliament. Now therefore, in exercise of the powers conferred under section 59 - 1 of the Fijian Constitution of the Republic of Fiji and section 21 of the Electoral Act of 2014, and on the advice of the Prime Minister, I command you to cause an election to be held according to law of 55 members to sit and vote in Parliament," President Katonivere stated. US Fiji Times is encouraging all would-be voters to cast their votes as it is of National importance that the People of Fiji exercise their Democratic Rights and choose their Government of preference. "We wish all our fellow Fijians the very best in the 2022 Elections".

Singapore's support to Fiji in times of need, particularly in our national rebuilding efforts from the COVID-19 pandemic; cyclones relief efforts, post disaster recovery in 2020; was also acknowledged at the meeting. The discussions also focused on cooperation in tackling climate change and partnership in the lead up to the COP27 in Egypt and beyond in line with the Paris Agreement. Prospects for economic cooperation in shared priorities, mainly trade, investment, tourism, Information and **Communications Technology** (ICT), and digital connectivity were also outlined at the meeting. partner with Singapore on specific areas in the South-South Cooperation programs that can benefit Pacific Islands Countries. Fiji News CENTRECOM OPENS SECOND BRANCH IN NADI

Centrecom opened its second branch in Nadi yesterday (21/10/22), employing close to more than 600 Fijians around the country since its inception in 2014. In his remarks at the opening of the new branch, Attorney-General Aiyaz Sayed-Khaiyum said that the Fijian Government has always been committed to ensuring that policies are stable, which includes ensuring that free education is accessible to all Fijians. The A-G explained that the vision of free education enabled companies like Centrecom to set up branches locally because Fiji has a knowledgebased society capable of providing the services that will stimulate the economy. He also highlighted new investments exceeding \$10 million in infrastructure that supports Business

Process Outsourcing companies like call centres and accounting services will be offered a 20year tax holiday. The 10 year and 15 year tax holiday will also be available for investments between \$2 million to \$5 million and \$5 million to \$10 million, respectively. Sharing similar sentiments Pacific Centrecom (Fiji) Ltd General Manager, Carol Watkins, highlighted that Fiji has a lot of potential in the business processing outsourcing (BPO) industry and has commended the Fijian government for providing opportunities for the BPO sector to access tax incentives that will create more jobs for Fijians. With the ideal new location for the Centrecom branch in Nadi, Ms Watkins added that the company plans to expand in the northern division.



PALM SCHEME WILL NOT EMPTY VILLAGES - BALA



Villages will not be emptied by the Pacific Australia Labour Mobility Scheme (PALM). This was highlighted by the Minister for Employment, Productivity and Industrial Relations, Youth and Sports, Parveen Kumar Bala, while bidding farewell to 108 selected Fijian workers under the scheme this week. Minister Bala highlighted that these comments were made by some individuals without contemplating the benefits it brings to Fijian families and their communities. "This scheme will improve living standards for the families of the selected workers and it is the current Fijian Government's initiative towards alleviating poverty." "The scheme has caused transformation and empowered Fijian families to

have improved living standards through better homes, support for their children's education, financial assistance towards community projects such as the construction of community halls and churches and the establishment of small businesses in the community, to name a few," said Bala. "Also this initiative will minimize rural to-urban drift for employment opportunities in our towns and cities as these workers continue to develop their community through remittances received, " he added. "The PALM Scheme under the Vuvale partnership with the Australian Government has enormously contributed to Fiji's sustainable economic recovery due to the COVID-19 pandemic.

Britain To Hold Bank Holiday For King Charles' Coronation

British Prime Minister Rishi Sunak said the crowning of King Charles III will be celebrated with an extra bank holiday across the country on Monday May 8, shortly after the coronation itself on 6 May.

King Charles, 73, automatically became king on the death of his mother Queen Elizabeth in September, but the grand coronation ceremony for him and his wife Camilla is taking place next year. The late Queen's coronation in 1953 was accompanied by an extra bank holiday and granting one in 2023 would follow that tradition, said the Prime Minister's office, giving time for families and communities to enjoy the historic event.

"The coronation of a new monarch is a unique moment for our country," Rishi Sunak said in the statement on Sunday. "In recognition of this historic occasion, I am pleased to announce an additional bank holiday for the whole United Kingdom next year." The ceremony will take place at London's Westminster Abbey and will follow the traditional pageantry used for anointing monarchs over the last 1,000 years.

Kings and queens of England,



and later Britain and the United Kingdom, have been crowned at Westminster Abbey since William the Conqueror in 1066. Charles is the 41st monarch in a line that traces its origins back to William, and he will be the oldest monarch to be crowned. Charles is king and head of state not only of the United Kingdom but of 14 other realms including Australia, Canada, Jamaica, New Zealand and Papua New Guinea. This year, Britain has had two extra bank holidays,

one to celebrate the Queen Elizabeth's Platinum Jubilee in June, and the second on the day of her funeral in September.

India, UK Working Sincerely On Free Trade Agreement: Centre

India on Thursday said it is working "sincerely" with the UK for finalisation of the proposed free trade agreement, days after Prime Minister Narendra Modi and his British counterpart Rishi Sunak agreed on the "early conclusion" of the deal."Both sides are working sincerely on the free trade agreement," External Affairs Ministry Spokesperson Arindam Bagchi said. His comments came when asked about the FTA during a media briefing. "As we have said earlier, the matter of negotiations is best left to the trade ministers and their teams of officials. I cannot comment on the status. I certainly do not have any target date," Mr Bagchi said. The issue of the FTA figured in the first telephonic conversation

between the two prime ministers on October 27. In a tweet on his talks with Rishi Sunak, PM Modi said: "Congratulated him on assuming charge as UK PM. We will work together to further strengthen our Comprehensive Strategic Partnership. We also agreed on the importance of early conclusion of a comprehensive and balanced FTA." In April, the two sides had set a Diwali deadline for concluding the FTA but the deal could not be finalised in view of differences over certain issues. It is learnt that External Affairs Minister S Jaishankar and British Foreign Secretary James Cleverly took stock of the ongoing negotiations for the FTA during their talks here last week. Cleverly visited India to



attend a United Nations meet on counter-terrorism. To a question on the US not having a full time ambassador to India, Mr Bagchi said "we would hope the position would be filled soon". The Biden administration had in July 2021 announced the nomination of Los Angeles Mayor Eric Garcetti as the next US Ambassador to India.

England Prime Minister UK's Rishi Sunak Committed To Free Trade Pact With India: Downing Street

Intensive negotiations continue towards a free trade agreement (FTA) between India and the UK and new British Prime Minister Rishi Sunak is committed to achieving a balanced deal, Downing Street said on Wednesday. Rishi Sunak, who took charge at 10 Downing Street last week, had a "very warm" introductory call with Prime Minister Narendra Modi during which both sides expressed their commitment towards an FTA. The UK Prime Minister's office also reiterated that the focus remains on a balanced trade deal that benefits both sides and therefore no timeframe is being specified after a proposed Diwali timeline had to be abandoned last month amid political turmoil in the UK. "Both sides are very committed to it, intensive negotiations are continuing led by the Department for International Trade (DIT)," a spokesperson told reporters at a Downing Street briefing. "The Prime Minister had a very warm, introductory

call with Prime Minister Modi last week. In terms of the speed of it [FTA], we have been very clear that we won't sacrifice quality to achieve speed. We will sign when we have a balanced deal that represents both of our interests but both sides remain committed," the spokesperson said. In his first phone call after taking charge as Prime Minister last week, Rishi Sunak had referenced "good progress" being made to finalise the FTA. "The Prime Minister hoped the UK and India could continue to make good progress in negotiations to finalise a comprehensive Free Trade Agreement," a Downing Street readout of the call said. The two leaders are expected to meet in person at the G20 Summit in Indonesia later this month, unless they meet at the COP27 Summit in Egypt where the UK Prime Minister has confirmed attendance of the Leader's Day but PM Modi's visit is as yet unconfirmed. Rishi Sunak is on the record expressing his commitment to an FTA



with India while Chancellor of the Exchequer at No. 11 Downing Street when he flagged financial services as a particularly "exciting" aspect of the bilateral trade relationship. The City of London Corporation, the financial hub of the UK capital, has expressed the hope that Rishi Sunak's focus on services would take the FTA in the right direction. "Services make up around 70 per cent of annual trade between our countries. So, a deal that doesn't deliver for this sector would be a missed opportunity," said Chris Hayward, Policy Chairman at the City of London Corporation. The focus of the FTA negotiations is on reducing the barriers to trade, cutting tariffs, and supporting easier imports and exports into each other's markets.According to official UK government data, India-UK bilateral trade currently stands at around GBP 24.3 billion a year and the aim is for that to be at least doubled by 2030.

"Huge Error Of Judgment": UK MP On Rishi Sunak's Controversial Pick

British Prime Minister Rishi Sunak faced growing pressure Sunday after reappointing interior minister Suella Braverman despite her resignation over a security breach. Mr Sunak reinstated Ms Braverman as Home Secretary when he became prime minister, just days after she quit predecessor Liz Truss's short-lived government. **Opposition Labour MP Yvette** Cooper on Sunday slammed Sunak's "irresponsible" reappointment of Braverman to the position in charge of domestic security issues, also telling Sky News there were questions over possible other security breaches by Braverman. "It really shows the huge error of judgment that Rishi Sunak has made in reappointing someone just six days after she broke the ministerial code over security lapses," Ms Cooper said. "National security is too important for this kind of chaos, confusion and really irresponsible decision making." Ms Cooper spoke after Labour leader Keir Starmer on Friday said Mr Sunak should sack Suella Braverman, calling it the "strong thing to do". Ms Braverman is seen as representing the most right-wing Tory MPs. She has enthusiastically supported a plan to send migrants arriving illegally in the UK to Rwanda. She reportedly had rowed with Ms Truss over immigration policy but quit over a security breach: sending a sensitive document to her private email account and then forwarding it on. Mr Sunak has insisted that Ms Braverman acknowledged her mistake and took responsibility. Mr Sunak ally Michael Gove, who has returned to the job he did under Boris Johnson's premiership as minister for "levelling up", defended Ms Braverman on Sundav as a "first-rate front-rank politician". He told Sky News Ms Braverman is "working hard



in order to ensure that our borders can be made more secure, and that policing is more effective". Mr Gove told the BBC it was his "understanding" that Ms Braverman swiftly reported the incident in the appropriate way, while the broadcaster reported it had been shown an email from Braverman asking the recipient: "Can you delete the message and ignore?" Mr Gove insisted such a message would be "standard practice". The scandal came as the Mail on Sunday published an unconfirmed report that Truss's personal phone was hacked by suspected Kremlin agents while she was serving as foreign minister.Mr Gove told Sky he did not know whether the story was true, but stressed: "We take security issues incredibly seriously".







FIFA World Cup "Brazil No More Dependent On Neymar": Cafu Ahead Of 2022 Qatar World Cup

Legendary footballer Cafu believes Brazil are no longer a one-player side, relying heavily on Neymar, and have it in them to win a record sixth World Cup title in Qatar. The record fivetime winners are yet to lift the World Cup trophy since they defeated Germany 2-0 in the 2002 final. Since then it has been European dominance in the mega showpiece. "Now Brazil isn't dependent on Neymar especially this year because there are several players like Vinicius Junior, Rodrygo, Richarlison and Lucas Paqueta," the two-time World Cup winner told reporters on the sidelines of his four-day sojourn in India. "Those players are also capable of winning the Cup for Brazil and this year the side is much different but four years ago, it was all Neymar. If this question was asked to me four years back then I would have agreed that Brazil was very much dependent (on Neymar)." Brazil are clubbed with Serbia, Switzerland and Cameroon in Group G. The top-two teams will advance to the last-16. The quadrennial showpiece kicks off

on November 20 when hosts Qatar take on Ecuador. Brazil will open their campaign with a match against Serbia at the Lusail Stadium on November 24. The desert heat in May-June had forced the organisers to push back the tournament to November-December for the first time ever. "Normally the World Cup starts in June, but this year it's going to start in November. It's also an advantage for some players because normally when the league used to stop then World Cup starts so players can resume with their training and it'll be a big boost for their national team. "It's going to be attractive to have the World Cup in November as in June the players are more tired and now since the league has started the players are fresh and can play well. "I hope Brazil would do well in this World Cup and win it." One of the all time great fullbacks, Cafu feels 'sad' that the quality in defence is missing these days. "I'm very happy to have played with Maldini and Nesta. But I am very sad that we cannot see



any good full backs nowadays, probably because of the lack of quality. But I'm very happy to have played alongside all these big names." Cafu will play an 'All Star' exhibition match along with Indian tennis legend Leander Paes and hold football clinics at Mohammedan Sporting on Saturday. Listen to the latest songs, only on JioSaavn.com Excited to see the football craze in the country, Cafu hoped India would get to play in the World Cup one day. "I would be very excited to see India playing in the World Cup and since I have come to India now, I wish India get to play in the World Cup," he concluded.

FIFA Calls On World Cup Teams To "Focus On Football" In Qatar

FIFA has called on the teams participating in the controversial Qatar World Cup to "focus on football" and stop "handing out moral lessons" in a letter revealed by Sky News on ThursdayFIFA has called on the teams participating in the controversial Qatar World Cup to "focus on football" and stop "handing out moral lessons" in a letter revealed by Sky News on Thursday. Qatar has faced criticism for its human rights record on the treatment of foreign workers on major infrastructure projects for the World Cup, on women's rights and LGBTQ rights. Homosexuality is illegal in the Gulf state and captains from a number of leading European countries, including England, France and Germany, will wear armbands in rainbow colours with the message "One Love" in an anti-discrimination campaign. Last week, the Australian national team condemned the "suffering" of migrant workers. "Please let's now focus on the football!" FIFA president Gianni Infantino and secretary general Fatma Samoura said in a letter sent to all 32 World Cup teams, confirmed to AFP by world football's governing body. "We know football does not live in a vacuum and we are equally aware that there are many challenges and difficulties of a political nature all around the world.

"But please do not allow football to be dragged into every ideological or political battle that exists." Qatar organisers have defended the country's rights record. After the Australian players' criticism, a World Cup spokesperson said imposing "robust" labour laws had also been a "challenge" for



Australia. Earlier this week, the Arab League states slammed criticism of Qatar as a "defamation campaign" ahead of the tournament.

"One of the great strengths of the world is indeed its very diversity, and if inclusion means anything, it means having respect for that diversity," continued the FIFA letter. "No one people or culture or nation is 'better' than any other." Qatar Labour Minister Ali bin Samikh Al Marri told AFP on Wednesday that calls for a new compensation fund for migrant workers was a "publicity stunt". He also accused some of the country's critics of "racism". "They don't want to allow a small country, an Arab country, an Islamic country, to organise the World Cup," Marri said.

FIFA World Cup Lionel Messi Heads To World Cup Ready For Last Chance To Match Diego Maradona

Lionel Messi has been building up to this moment, aware that his fifth World Cup with Argentina almost certainly represents his last chance to get his hands on the trophy. In July he reported back a week early for pre-season training with Paris Saint-Germain and since then he has looked like a man on a mission, determined to head to Qatar in the best shape possible. After a difficult first year at PSG in which he struggled to overcome the trauma of his departure from Barcelona, Messi is now back to something like his best and has scored or assisted 26 goals in 18 games for his club this season. Meanwhile, in Argentina a nation has been holding its breath, hoping the seven-time Ballon d'Or winner does not succumb to an untimely injury. Messi first went to a World Cup as a teenager in 2006 and has scored a record 90 goals from a record 164 caps. He captained Argentina to the final of the 2014 World Cup but 2018 was a desperate disappointment, with Jorge Sampaoli's side losing in the last 16 to a France team featuring Kylian Mbappe, now Messi's teammate in Paris. Now aged 35, Messi goes to Qatar remarkably still looking to score his first goal in the knockout stages of a World

Cup, never mind actually win it. "I feel good physically at the moment. Better than last year, when I arrived at PSG. But when I said this could be my last World Cup, I did so because of my age. After this one finishes we will see how I'm feeling," he said in a recent interview with Directv Sports. "For us, like for all Argentines, it is difficult to be calm, because we are contenders to win the World Cup. "But to win the World Cup you need lots of things to go in your favour, in any given match or in the competition as a whole. But we are going there to fight and we are ready to take on anyone." - Different role - If Messi is to emulate Diego Maradona, who led Argentina to their last World Cup triumph in 1986, he cannot do it alone. There may be nobody as good as him in Lionel Scaloni's side, but they appear a much more convincing team than four years ago, when they were fortunate just to get out of their group in Russia. Argentina go to Qatar on a 35-game unbeaten run that includes their victory in last year's Copa America, their first major tournament success since 1993. There are more survivors from 2018, including Angel Di Maria, who scored the winner against Brazil at the Maracana in that



Copa America final. But there are others who have become key players under Scaloni, from Cristian Romero in central defence to Leandro Paredes and Rodrigo de Paul in midfield and Lautaro Martinez up front. Martinez, the 25-year-old Inter Milan striker, matched Messi's tally of seven goals in qualifying and certainly removes some of the pressure on his captain in that department. Messi's role in the team has changed, according to Omar Larrosa, who played in the Argentina side that won the 1978 World Cup on home soil. "I think he's going to be different in this World Cup. He is the one making others play now, whereas at previous World Cups his teammates were always giving him the ball," Larrosa told AFP. "I think he's doing his job very well now. You can't ask any more of him." As skipper, Messi is not only an inspiration to his teammates because of what he does with the ball, as footage released this week of his speech inside the dressing room before last year's Copa America final showed. If Argentina go all the way to the final in Doha then Messi will have the chance to overtake the record for most matches played at a World Cup, which is currently held by Lothar Matthaeus on 25. He may be arguably the greatest player of all time, but it is now or never if he is to crown a magnificent career by winning the greatest prize of all.

Germany Striker Timo Werner Ruled Out Of World Cup With Ankle Injury

Germany striker Timo Werner has been ruled out of the upcoming World Cup in Qatar with an ankle injury, his club RB Leipzig announced on Thursday. Werner hobbled off early in Leipzig's 4-0 Champions League win over Shakhtar Donetsk on Wednesday. "Scans today in Leipzig showed that he has unfortunately torn the syndesmosis ligament in his left ankle and will therefore be out for the rest of 2022," the Bundesliga team said in a statement. The 26-year-old has scored 24 goals in 55 international appearances for Germany and netted five times during qualifying.

"This news is very bitter," said Germany coach Hansi Flick. "I'm very sorry for Timo personally because he's missing out on the World Cup, which he really wanted to play. "But Timo's absence is a great loss, especially for the team. We have to have an excellent striker with a strong goal rate in the national jersey and we'll also be without a real team player. "First of all, we all wish that Timo gets fit again quickly."

Werner rejoined Leipzig from Premier League giants Chelsea in the close season and has contributed nine goals already in all competitions this campaign. Germany kick off their bid for a record-equalling fifth World Cup against Japan on November 23 in Al Rayyan, before further Group E matches against Spain and Costa Rica. Bayern Munich winger Leroy Sane is also currently sidelined with a knee injury, with Werner's absence adding to Flick's problems up front.

Borussia Dortmund youngster Karim Adeyemi and inform Werder Bremen striker Niclas Fuellkrug could be possible replacements for Werner in the squad. Germany captain and goalkeeper Manuel Neuer has not played since October 8 due to a shoulder injury and is also a doubt for the global showpiece. Flick will name his 26-man squad for the tournament on November 16.

Dementia Risk Linked to How Long Blood Pressure Stays In 'Target Range'

Maintaining a healthy blood pressure has been previously linked to a reduced risk of developing dementia, among other conditions. Now, a new study recently published in the journal CirculationTrusted Source suggests the duration over which blood pressure is kept within a "target range" may also be a critical factor in staving off brain disease. The findings will be presented at the American Heart Association's Scientific Sessions conference in Chicago November 5-7 and are considered preliminary until published fully in a peer-reviewed journal. The study is believed to be the first to explore the association between the length of time blood pressure levels stay within a healthy target range and dementia risk. Blood pressure levels and dementia diagnoses Scientists at Beijing Anzhen Hospital in China examined data pertaining to 8,415 individuals, which was collected as part of the Systolic Blood Pressure Intervention Trial (SPRINT) led by the National Institutes of Health (NIH). Participants had an average age of 68, and all had been diagnosed with high blood pressure — but none showed signs of cognitive impairment or decline at the start of the trial. Blood pressure readings were taken once a month during the first 3 months of the trial to help determine the target range - aka "ideal" blood pressure levels. Participants' cognitive statuses were measured 2 years after the trial began and again another 2 years later. Participants whose systolic blood pressure levels stayed within the target range for more prolonged periods were less likely to receive a probable dementia diagnosis. In fact, for every additional 31.5% of time spent within the target range, the risk for dementia lowered by 16%. Staying within a target blood pressure range The researchers stated that consistency is more important than having fluctuating blood pressure with an average figure that falls within the target range. "Fluctuations with high and low blood pressure can be an added stress on our bodies," Dr. Rajesh Gupta,

an interventional cardiologist and associate professor at The University of Toledo College of Medicine and Life Sciences. "Each organ system, including our heart, brain, and kidneys, learns to live within a certain blood pressure range, and fluctuations can cause organ stress or damage."

Despite the implications of the new research, the study was a retrospective that looked at previously collected data, which means there's a notable gap in the findings. "These kinds of trials [such as SPRINT] can't tell you what 'dose' of time in target range would make the difference," Dr. Stanley S. Liu, a cardiologist at the University of Maryland Medical Center and assistant professor of medicine at the University of Maryland School of Medicine, told Healthline. As such, the new research wasn't able to explicitly state how long blood pressure should stay in a particular range, just that a longer duration is better. Determining healthy blood pressure levels There are two blood pressure measurements: systolic and diastolic. For the study, the researchers focused on systolic blood pressure. SystolicTrusted Source blood pressure is the pressure your blood puts on your artery walls during a heartbeat. Diastolic blood pressure shows the pressure on your artery walls

between heartbeats. In a blood pressure reading (i.e., 130/82 mmHg), the first number refers to systolic, and the second is diastolic. HealthyTrusted Source blood pressure is considered less than 120/80 mmHg. High blood pressure - also known as hypertension — is experienced by almost half of adultsTrusted Source in the United States. "Hypertension can occur with elevation of either systolic pressure, diastolic pressure, or both," said Dr. Patrick Azcarate, a cardiologist with the Miami Cardiac and Vascular Institute, told Healthline. What's more, there are very few noticeable signs of high blood pressure — meaning many people are unaware they even have it. "Some people will notice that they have a headache or feel off when their blood pressure is high, but most people do not feel anything," Tyler said. What causes high blood pressure? Age is a key factor in developing high blood pressure levels. As people get older, Liu explained that "blood vessels become more stiff [or] less flexible, and blood pressure is tougher to regulate." Other factors that may cause high blood pressure may include: obesity diabetes diet sleep quality and quantity sleep apnea stress levels smoking genetic or organ-specific problems (i.e., polycystic kidney disease, hyperthyroidism,

hyperadrenalism) How blood pressure impacts the brain High blood pressure can affect both the heart and the brain. "While they may seem unrelated, blood vessel health and blood pressure is very closely linked with brain health and prevention of dementia," Liu said. "Brain blood vessels are vulnerable to damage from high blood pressure. We often see dementia caused by cumulative damage to the blood vessels that eventually injure the brain through lack of oxygen to brain cells (something we call vascular dementia)." Damage to blood vessels and arteries due to high blood pressure is a primary cause of stroke --- with research from 2019Trusted Source indicating that 1 in 5 people who experience a stroke will develop dementia. "We know that kidneys develop structural damage after being exposed to years of high blood pressure. The same is true for the heart and brain," Gupta added. Tips to maintain healthy blood pressure High blood pressure is a risk factor for dementia that some people may be able to control. Here are a few ways you can manage your blood pressure on a regular basis: Exercise. "This is the best way to reduce your blood pressure," said Azcarate. "Currently, we recommend at least 30 minutes of moderateintensity exercise 4-5 times per week." Control sodium intake.

Your diet should include less than 2,300 mg of sodium per day, which can be difficult to do with a typical Western diet. Eat a healthy diet. The researchbacked DASH diet (Dietary Approaches to Stop Hypertension), which emphasizes fruits, vegetables, and nuts, can help get high blood pressure levels under control. Get sufficient sleep. Adults should try to aim for 7 hours of sleep per night. "Sleep quality and quantity is incredibly important to maintain healthy blood pressure," Liu said. Check in with your doctor. You can work with your doctor to accurately measure and control your blood pressure. When necessary, blood pressure medications may be an option. Takeaway Regulating blood pressure has been linked to staving off conditions such as heart attack, stroke, and dementia. Now, research suggests the length of time blood pressure remains within a healthy target range is also critical to reducing the risk of concerns, particularly cognitive decline. In addition to being monitored by your doctor, regularly checking your blood pressure can help alert you to possible issues. "You can check your blood pressure at pharmacies and drug stores that have free blood pressure machines," Tyler said. "You can also buy a home blood pressure cuff."

Kikau, Staines charged; Milne faces lengthy ban

Taane Milne is set to miss the World Cup for Fiji Bati after being hit with a 6-7 match ban. Bati co-captain Viliame Kikau is free to play in the NRL grand final with a guilty plea. Penrith forward Viliame Kikau is able to play in the 2022 NRL Telstra Premiership Grand Final after he was charged with a Grade One shoulder charge offence in his side's Preliminary Final victory. Kikau, who has already been cited for a shoulder charge offence this year, was charged with the Grade One offence for his tackle on Campbell Graham, bringing with it a fine of \$3,000 with an early guilty plea. Teammate Charlie Staines will also be eligible for selection after he

too was charged with a Grade One Shoulder Charge offence - his charge resulting in a fine of \$1,500 with an early guilty plea or \$2,000 if he unsuccessfully contests the offence at the judiciary. Rabbitohs winger Taane Milne will miss at least the next six games after he was sensationally sent off for his high tackle on Spencer Leniu late in the game. Milne, who was named as part of the extended Fiji squad for next month's Rugby League World Cup, is facing a six-match ban with an early guilty plea or a seven-match ban if he unsuccessfully contests the charge at the judiciary. He will join Cowboys forward Jason Taumalolo on the sidelines to

start the opening World Cup matches after he was charged with a dangerous contact offence in side's defeat to Parramatta. Taumalolo was sin-binned for the tackle on Eels forward Isaiah Papali'i in the 15th minute of Friday's finals match and has subsequently been charged by the Match Review Committee with a Grade Two Dangerous Contact charge. With an early guilty plea, Taumalolo will miss the opening three matches of Tonga's World Cup campaign or four matches if he unsuccessfully contests the charge. Panthers winger Taylan May will be available for selection following his one-game suspension for a careless high tackle,



but will now need to overcome a hamstring injury by Wednesday

in order to take his place in this year's Grand Final.

Flying Fijians Head Coach Vern Cotter has named three debutants in the 23-member team which kicks off their Autumn Nations Cup campaign against Scotland on Sunday. Ratu Leone Rotuisolia, who missed the opportunity while in camp during the mid-year internationals, has finally made his cut into the run-on team. Former Fijian 7s and Olympic Games Gold Medalist, Sireli Maqala and Livai Natave are expected to earn their first cap off the bench. Cotter said Magala has been impressive during training and gives them a number of options to play in the backline. "He has impressed us with his skill sets. He can kick well, with the ball he is strong and tough and he offers us a number of positions as he can play at number 10, 15, and at the center" said Cotter. Saracens-based in-form Loosehead Prop Eroni Mawi, experienced Hooker Sam Matavesi and Tighthead prop Manasa Saulo complete the front row while Temo Mayanavanua pairs up with Ratu Leone Rotuisolia at locks. Albert Tuisue will be at the blindside flank while in an interesting move, Levani Botia will strengthen the forward pack from the openside flanks position. Viliame Mata returns



from injury and starts at number eight. In the backs, Frank Lomani and Vilimoni Botitu will share the halves combination while Kalaveti Ravouvou and skipper Waisea Nayacalevu will control the play in the midfield. Brazil, Indonesia and DRC in talks to form 'Opec of rainforests'

The big three tropical rainforest nations – Brazil, Indonesia and the Democratic Republic of the Congo – are in talks to form a strategic alliance to coordinate on their conservation, nicknamed an "Opec for rainforests", the Guardian understands. The election of Luiz Inácio Lula da Silva, known as Lula, has been followed by a flurry of activity to avoid the destruction of the Amazon, which scientists have warned is dangerously close to tipping point after years of deforestation under its far-right leader, Jair Bolsonaro. During his first speech as president-elect, Lula pledged to fight for zero deforestation in the Amazon, while Colombia has proposed creating an Amazon bloc at Cop27, and Norway's environment minister is moving to reinstate a billiondollar fund to protect the rainforest after it was halted under Bolsonaro, Brazil, Indonesia and DRC are home to 52% of the world's remaining primary tropical forests, which are crucial to avoiding climate catastrophe, and the conservation talks are fulfilling a campaign promise by Lula.

The alliance could see the rainforest countries make joint proposals on carbon markets and finance, a longtime sticking point at UN climate and biodiversity talks, as part of an effort to encourage developed countries to fund their conservation, which is key to limiting global heating to 1.5C (2.7F) above pre-industrial levels. The three countries - home to the Amazon, Congo basin and Borneo and Sumatra forests, which are threatened by commercial logging, mining and illegal exploitation – signed an agreement at Cop26 in Glasgow to halt and reverse deforestation by 2030. Oscar Soria, campaign director of the activism site Avaaz, said the alliance could be an "Opec for rainforests", akin to the oil producers' cartel, which coordinates on the fossil fuel's production levels and price. Before being elected. Lula said any alliance could be expanded to other rainforest countries, such as Peru and Cambodia. "This deal could be a promising step forward, as long as Indigenous

peoples and local communities are fully consulted in the process and their rights and leadership respected," Soria said. "These three ecosystems are critical for the ecological stability of the world, and the answer for these forests to thrive lies with the people that live in them."

Carlos Nobre, a Brazilian Earth system scientist and cochair of the Science Panel for the Amazon (SPA), said Lula's election was a moment of opportunity for rainforest conservation. "The president-elect is already working with DRC and Indonesia to protect all tropical forests on the planet. He also reiterated the commitment of his government to get to zero deforestation in the Brazilian Amazon during his presidency," he said, explaining that SPA would launch a proposal for an "arc of restoration" covering more than 1m hectares (about 4,000 sq miles), mainly in the southern Amazon near the Andes. "Implementing such a project will protect the Amazon rainforest from reaching the tipping point and also will remove more than 1bn tonnes of CO2 from the atmosphere for several decades a mandatory goal to combat the climate emergency," he said. Joseph Itongwa Mukumo, an Indigenous Walikale from DRC's North Kivu province, said any alliance must recognise the role Indigenous communities play in protecting forests. He said: "The IPCC [UN Intergovernmental Panel on Climate Change] scientists tasked with advising Cop negotiators made clear in a recent report the urgent need to recognise the rights of Indigenous peoples and support adaptation of ecosystems, calling us 'fundamental to reducing the risks of climate change and for effective adaptation (with a very high level of confidence)'. "Proposals to conserve tropical forests that fail to protect the rights of Indigenous peoples and local communities in the forests of Africa, Latin America and Indonesia, cannot succeed." At Cop26 in Glasgow last year, three big initiatives to protect the world's forests were launched: a commitment by more than 140 world leaders to halt and reverse deforestation,



the creation of a working group of producers and consumers of commodities linked to deforestation, and a commitment by major commodity producers of soya, palm oil, cocoa and cattle to align their business practices with the 1.5C target. However, despite the agreement, data from Global Forest Watch shows that Brazil, DRC and Indonesia were among the top five countries for primary forest loss in 2021, with 11.1m hectares of tree cover lost in the tropics overall last year. Canada orders China to divest from country's mining companies

Canada has ordered China to immediately sell its holdings in three Canadian mining companies, as the need for investments in the extraction of critical minerals clashes with growing concerns over national security. On Wednesday Canada's industry minister, François-Philippe Champagne, said three Chinese companies would be required to divest from junior mining companies."While Canada continues to welcome foreign direct investment, we will act decisively when investments threaten our national security and our critical minerals supply chains, both at home and abroad," Champagne said in a written statement. The order comes after a "multi-step" review by Canada's national security and intelligence agencies, which determined that the three companies must leave the Canadian mining industry on national security grounds.

Critical minerals and metals include lithium, cadmium, nickel and cobalt. They are essential for clean energy technologies, including turbines and electric cars and solar panels. They are also a necessary part of laptop computers and rechargeable batteries. In recent years, China has become the largest refiner and processor of critical minerals, building an extensive supply chain that relies on overseas mines for raw materials. Canada has extensive, largely undeveloped deposits of nickel and cobalt and Chinese companies have made up a growing share



of foreign investment in the industry. Earlier this year, the Canadian mining company Neo Lithium Corp was taken over by the Chinese state-controlled firm Zijin Mining Group Co, a move that prompted parliamentary hearings into the possible national security threats posed by increased investment by China. According to Champagne's directive, Sinomine (Hong Kong) Rare Metals Resources Co Ltd, Chengze Lithium International Ltd and Zangge Mining Investment (Chengdu) Co Ltd must sell their stakes in Power Metals Corp, Lithium Chile Inc and Ultra Lithium Inc. The move comes a week


after Ottawa tightened rules on foreign investments in the critical mineral sector. Champaign said investments by state-owned firms will only be approved on "an exceptional basis" and will apply not only to takeovers, but also small investments. Amid concerns over China's growing dominance, nations have banded together. Earlier this year, countries including Britain, Canada, the US and Australia established a global partnership to secure access to critical minerals. Relations between China and Canada have remained tense since the arrests of the Huawei executive Meng Wenzhou, and the Canadian businessmen Michael Kovrig and Michael Spavor in 2018. Recent reports that China is operating covert police stations inside Canada, prompting an investigation by federal police, has further chilled relations. China pushed back on Thursday, calling Canada's move a breach of cooperation between the two nations and an attempt to damage global supply chains.

"China urges Canada to stop the unreasonably targeting Chinese companies [in Canada] and provide [the companies] with a fair, impartial and nondiscriminatory business environment," a Chinese foreign ministry spokesperson. Zhao







Australia break Fiji hearts to win Hong Kong Sevens

Australia beat Fiji 20-17 with a last gasp try to win sensational Hong Kong Sevens title France claim the bronze medal thanks to a 19-17 victory over Samoa Return of Cathay Pacific/HSBC Hong Kong Sevens a resounding success with world class sevens played in front of a large and vibrant crowd Hong Kong was the first of 11 rounds in the men's 2023 World Series, the women's Series starts with a combined event in Dubai on 2-3 December 2022 The 2023 Series is set to be the most competitive yet, with Paris 2024 Olympic qualification and Series relegation at stake Australia clinched a thrilling final 20-17 to claim the Cathay Pacific/HSBC Hong Kong Sevens crown and bring to an end Fiji's dominance that had seen them take the last five titles. in Hong Kong. A pulsating endto-end final played in an electrifying atmosphere was settled in the final minute when Nathan Lawson scored in the corner to cue wild celebrations from the Australia contingent. It had been 1,308 days since the last final was played in Hong Kong back in 2019, and the highly anticipated comeback edition certainly made up for lost time with a classic encounter between Fiji and Australia. Double Olympic champions Fiji led through tries from Josua Vakurinabili and a pair from Waisea Nacuqu, but Australia hit back through Henry Hutchison, twice, and Tim Clements before Lawson sealed the comeback victory to continue the fantastic form which saw them clinch the 2022 HSBC World Rugby Sevens Series title Fiji were aiming to continue their love affair with Hong Kong with a record breaking sixth straight title but it was not to be for the Pacific Islanders. France were losing finalists last time Hong Kong hosted a Series event in 2019 but had to settle for bronze on this occasion, seeing off Samoa 19-17 thanks to a pair of tries from Stephen Parez Edo Martin and one from tournament top try scorer Aaron Grandidier who ran in 11 tries and 55 points over the weekend. This was perhaps the most hotly contested Hong Kong Sevens in history as two quarter-finals and one semi-final required ex-



tra time to separate the teams in highly competitive contests, before the closely fought bronze and gold medal finals. Australia reached the final with a 10-7 win over a valiant France outfit thanks to a finely executed golden point penalty kick from the outstanding Maurice Longbottom following an earlier try from Josh Turner. Longbottom had already shown match-winning exploits earlier in the day, scoring a sensational try in extra time as Australia performed a remarkable comeback from 19-5 down to beat Ireland 26-19 in the quarter-final. Australia had qualified for the knock-out matches thanks to pool victories over New Zealand (24-17) and Hong Kong (43-0) despite a 22-17 defeat to Samao who to Fiji's route to the final saw them squeeze past Commonwealth champions South Africa 12-7 with tries from Joseva Talacolo and Jeremaia Matana to clinch in a tense quarter-final, before overcoming Pacific neigbours Samoa 19-7 in a pulsating semifinal, with two scores from Filipe Sauturaga and one from Joseva Talacolo. Fiji had progressed through their pool on Friday and Saturday with free-scoring wins over Japan (59-12), Spain (35-

21) and the USA (24-0). Samoa had earlier broken Argentinean hearts with a try from Vaovasa Afa Sua in extra time securing a 19-14 quarter-final victory, while France proved too strong for USA in the last quarter-final with a pair of tries from Aaron Grandidier. The highly experienced Olympic bronze medallists Argentina beat a vouthful USA 36-0 to finish fifth. New Zealand bounced back from their disappointment of failing to reach the quarter-finals in Hong Kong for the first time ever, by securing fifth place with a trio of victories on Sunday. The All Blacks Sevens triumphed over Kenya 34-0, Spain 24-7 and Canada 33-5 to finish ninth. Uruguay showed plenty of potential on their debut as a Series core team, recording impressive victories over Great Britain (19-17), Kenya (10-7) and Japan (33-10) to finish in a respectable 13th place. Australia captain Nick Malouf said : "After having done so well last year, to come out here and back it up straightaway and win Hong Kong for the first time since 1988, incredible. I think we're cutting a few years off our coach's life leaving it so late! "We knew coming into this

weekend that we've just got to keep grinding and doing what we've been doing really well, working hard for each other and we know they're going to come for us now so we have got to keep getting better. "There's not much between the teams. This is the Olympic qualifying year, so everyone's going to be coming in red hot and it's going to make for great viewing and tough games on the pitch." Fiji coach Ben Gollings said: "At the end of the day, we made a final and we've been consistent. It's bitterly disappointing that we lost. Ultimately 30 seconds of rugby was the difference in the end but credit to the boys was a tough year and they stuck at it and like I said the consistency and being in another final is fantastic. Hong Kong was the first of 11 rounds on the men's HSBC World Rugby Sevens Series 2023, which promises to be the most competitive and exciting Series to date with more at stake than ever before as the top four ranked men's and women's teams will earn Olympic qualification for Paris 2024. At the other end of the table in the men's competition the number of teams for the 2024 Series will reduce from

16 to 12 to equal the number of women's teams and align with the Olympic competition structure, meaning fans can expect an intense battle to avoid relegation throughout the 2023 Series with every match and every point counting towards the final Series rankings. The Series' next stop is Dubai where the women's Series will commence, as part of a combined event with the men on 2-3 December 2022, before both men's and women's teams move on to Cape Town on 9-11 December. The women's pools for Dubai see the all-conquering reigning World, Commonwealth and Series champions Australia in Pool A alongside the USA, Canada and China. In Pool B reigning Olympic champions New Zealand will face France, Great Britain and Brazil, Pool C sees Olympic bronze medallists Fiji together with Ireland, Spain and newly promoted Japan. The men's draw sees Pool A with Australia, South Africa, Great Britain and Kenya. Pool B is Fiji, Argentina, New Zealand and Uruguay. Pool C includes France, Ireland, Spain and Uganda. Pool D is made up of Samoa, USA, Canada and Japan.

SCOTS OVERCOME FIJI FOR FIRST WIN OF END-OF-YEAR SERIES

It was unconvincing, but Scotland got the job done and recorded their first win of their campaign by beating Fiji 28-12 at Murrayfield on Saturday. The hosts were only 14-12 ahead at the break but pulled clear after the interval in a match where they outscored Fiji four tries to two. Victory came after Scotland started their end-of-year programme with a 16-15 loss to Australia at Murrayfield last weekend — a match where the Scots were without their England-based players for a Test that fell outside the official Autumn window. Scotland face New Zealand a week on Sunday before rounding off their Autumn series against Argentina. The hosts looked set for a smooth afternoon when Turner's early try put them ahead, but the visitors - under the charge of former Scotland head coach Vern Cotter – hit back with their tries

and temporarily had the hosts on the ropes. Touchdowns either side of the interval from Hastings and Van der Merwe helped Gregor Townsend's side regain the upper hand, however, before replacement White added a further score in the closing stages. In just the second minute, Fiji suffered a setback when debutant Rotuisolia was sent to the sin-bin for foul play. The hosts made the extra man count as they bossed the early stages and after a sustained period of pressure, Turner pushed his way over from a rolling maul in the seventh minute for the game's opening try. Hastings - given his chance to stake a claim for the stand-off berth vacated by high-profile absentee Finn Russell - was successful with the conversion. The Pacific islanders had a good chance to get their first points on the board in the 11th minute when they were

awarded a penalty in front of the posts, but Tuicuvu sent his kick wastefully wide from. Rugby League World Cup: Kiwis survive huge scare from Fiji to advance to semifinal

The Kiwis are through to the Rugby League World Cup semifinals - but not without an almighty scare from Fiji. The New Zealand side trailed for more than an hour and could have lost in the last few minutes, before eventually squeaking home 24-18. For a long time it felt like a repeat of the nightmare 2017 scenario, with Fiji set to ambush the Kiwis again at the quarter-final stage. Wing Jordan Rapana was an unlikely hero, kicking four pressure goals and diving over for a try on the hooter to seal the result. The Kiwis will face Australia next week, though they will need a quantum leap in quality to get close to the world champions. The Kiwis were down 12-0 after 17 minutes, then 18-6 early in the second half. They started to dominate in the final quarter, but had to defend three consecutive sets on their line in the final stages, where any score from the Bati would have seen New Zealand out of the tournament. The Kiwis walked the tightrope for most of the match and coach Michael Maguire's reaction said it all, as he was frozen in the seat

for a few minutes after the final whistle. This was meant to be the game that everything came together for the Kiwis - after mixed efforts in the group stages - but it never really happened as they were plagued by mistakes and ill-discipline, though they at least showed considerable courage and spirit to fight back. Fullback Joseph Manu was again outstanding-with 304 running metres - while the forwards did well to match up to a willing Fiji pack. Fiji were massive underdogs with the bookmakers but tore up the script with a remarkable performance. Maguire opted for Charnze Nicoll-Klokstad at centre, while Nelson Asofa-Solomona was in the second row, though he later switched to the middle. Everything that could go wrong in the first quarter from a Kiwis perspective, did. Fiji were up for the fight but the men in Black and White were their own worst enemies. They gave away needless yardage penalties, as well as six again sets, to give Fiji momentum and they were good enough to take advantage. Clever hands from Api Korois-

au and Viliame Kikau created space for Maika Sivo to power over – though Rapana and Peta Hiku had misread the numbers. Six minutes later, Kevin Naiqama ran a brilliant line to slice through between Dylan Brown and Nicoll-Klokstad to extend their lead. The Kiwis were in a hole. A clever scrum move created space for Ronaldo Mulitalo to flash over and Rapana responded to recent criticism to convert from the sideline. That should have been the start of something but it never eventuated in the first half, despite plenty of possession in the right areas. A long-range Mulitalo break went unrewarded and balls were dropped close to the line, as the committed Fijian defence compressed the space and time superbly. The issues continued after the break. Rapana coughed up near halfway before Naiqama scored a brilliant solo try, catching Brown cold from dummy half. Back rower Briton Nikora forced his way over through three defenders, to give the Kiwis some hope and they started to, finally, win the arm wrestle. A magnificent

Brandon Wakeham tackle prevented Mulitalo from scoring, before Kenny Bromwich shelled the ball metres before the line. A Mulitalo fumble then gifted the Fijians a goal-line dropout, though the Kiwis held on. New Zealand finally levelled in the 62nd minute through Manu, after Brown had created space for Mulitalo on the left flank. But the indiscipline continued, as a Hiku push gave away a penalty - via a captain's challenge -which meant a Sivo knock-on went unpunished. If that was unfortunate, the Kiwis got lucky with their own challenge, after

Manu was stripped of the ball and Rapana's clutch 30-metre penalty gave them the lead. But New Zealand still made it hard for themselves, with consecutive unforced errors inviting Fiji into their territory. It looked dicey – but somehow they hung on – before Rapana's late, late try finally put Fiji away, after the Kiwis managed a repeat set.
