Sigatoka murder suspect remanded

A 24-year-old man charged with murder has been remanded in custody. Osea Mataitoga was initially summarily charged with two counts of murder together with one count of robbery.

The alleged murder took place on February 2nd, last year in a settlement near Lawai. Sesha Reddy and Mirdu Chandra were found dead in their home. Prosecution had applied for the whole matter to be transferred to the High Court, however this was denied due to the nature of how the charges were made. Magistrate Joseph Daurewa ruled that Mataitoga be given the decision to elect whether his case with its initial charges be transferred to the High Court or be heard in the Magistrates court. The accused has chosen to have his case heard in the Magistrates court. Daurewa further ruled that Prosecution sever or separate the charges and re-appear before the Magistrate for mention on Monday September 26th at the Sigatoka Magistrates Court.

Fijian Prime Minister led Pacific Leaders in Historic and First Ever USA and Pacific Leaders Summit

In welcoming Pacific leaders to this first ever summit, President Biden thanked Fijian Prime Minister for his leadership of the Pacific Island Forum at such a challenging time.

President Biden released the first ever US Strategy for the

Pacific Islands and announced a new partnership with the Pacific region. This historic summit builds on nearly a year of diplomacy by Fiji's Prime Minister. In his role as chair of Pacific Forum, Prime Minister had invited President Biden tk address

Pacific Forum leaders meeting last year. President Biden became the first US President to do so. This was followed by a visit by US Secretary for State Department, Antony Blinken to Fiji earlier this year. Vice President Kamala Harris then spoke virtually to Pacific Leaders at the most recent meeting held in Suva in August.

Prime Minister Bainimarama described the Summit as not only historic; but one that will have hugely positive impacts on Fijian and Pacific Islanders families for a long time to come. Prime Minister held meetings

Local Doctor Scores Big W.H.O Role

Dr Alisha Sahukhan has been appointed by the World Health Organisation as a member of the panel of experts to review the International Health Regulations (IHR).



Dr Alisha Sahukhan has been appointed by the World Health Organisation as a member of the panel of experts to review the International Health Regulations (IHR).

This was revealed by Minister for Health and Medical Services, Dr Ifereimi Waqainabete on the margins of launching the Lymphatic Filariasis Mass Drug Administration rollout in Labasa yesterday.

How are they appointed?

The Director-General of WHO appoints the members of IHR Expert Roster in accordance with WHO Regulations for Expert Advisory Panels and Committees except as otherwise

stated in the IHR.

The International Health Regulations (IHR) 2005 are a legally binding agreement of 196 countries to build the capability to detect and report potential public health emergencies worldwide.

The regulations require that all countries have the ability to detect, assess, report, and respond to public health events.

The incumbent contributes by correspondence of technical information on developments in his or her field, and to offer advice as appropriate, spontaneously or upon request. Dr Sahukhan is currently the Head of Health Protection. She was instrumental in the formation of the COVID-19 Incident Management Team (IMT) which set up the framework and policies which led to the big COVID-19 vaccination implementation right to the opening of our international borders.

As a result, Fiji has seen strong economic recovery since our borders opened.

What it means for Fiji

Dr Waqainabete confirmed that this position would require Dr Sahukhan to travel to Geneva, Switzerland back and forth to attend meetings.

He credited the appointment as a recognition of the strength of the public health services offered in Fiji and the medical officers who put in the hard work to achieve this high status.

Dr Aalisha's medical profession began in 2011 when she became a medical intern following the completion of her studies from the Fiji School of Medicine (now Fiji National University).

After four years in the medical profession in Fiji, Dr Aalisha was Fiji's Fulbright Scholarship recipient.

This enabled her to study at the Emory University, Rollins School of Public Health in Atlanta, Georgia (for three years).

Upon returning in 2017, Dr Aalisha took up the post of Acting National Advisor Communicable Diseases. Dr Sahukhan's husband, a nephrologist, Dr Amrish Krishnan, said he was very proud of his wife's achievements.

Also given a big appointment in our health services, was Dr Mika Kama who is now the Medical Superintendent of Tamavua Twomey Hospital in Suva. "Dr Kama has really worked hard in that space and acting position and showed the qualities which allowed him to shoulder the responsibility and support the upgrades and gains the hospital had made over the years," Dr Waqainabete said.

President also announced substantial new and broadened engagements with Fiji and the Pacific; ranging from increased educational opportunities in the U.S; to collaboration on disaster response; to improved business and trade ties; and security cooperation. PM BAINIMARAMA HOLDS EXTENSIVE DISCUSSIONS WITH US BUSINESS LEADERS INCLUDING SPACEX, GOOGLE, AND FedEx

Prime Minister Voreqe Bainimarama has highlighted that Fiji has sought U.S private sector investments in its growing economy which is at the heart of the Blue Pacific. Prime Minister Voreqe Bainimarama, in a dialogue between Pacific leaders and US businesses, said that Fiji welcomes U.S business interests and investments in key growth sectors including tourism, BPO, food, and agriculture, health, information technology, green technology, and manufacturing. The session, hosted by the U.S Chamber of Commerce, was attended by Pacific leaders and senior U.S Business executives. who discussed opportunities for job creation through cuttingedge investments targeted at well-educated and skilled workers in Fiji. The Prime Minister said that Fijian businesses also sought greater market access in the U.S markets through partnerships with U.S companies. He urged the U.S Congress to fast-track the reauthorization of the Generalized System of Tariff Preferences with the addition of virgin coconut oil, sugar, fish, kava, mahogany,

and other products that can create tremendous value for our smallholder producers. At Government level, he highlighted that we are also actively seeking to open biosecurity pathways for essentials like wheat and other agricultural produce, as quickly as possible between Fiji and the USA. Whilst delving into Fiji's COVID-19 economic recovery efforts, Prime Minister Bainimarama said that our tourism sector rebounded from the pandemic with high visitor numbers. The total number of international visitor arrivals to Fiji in July 2022 was 78,638 and this represented 81% of visitor numbers when compared to July 2019. He added that the U.S is one of Fiji's key source markets for tourism which had 42,002 visitors from January to August 2022 and accounted for 11% of Fiji's visitor arrivals. "My Government reforms have made doing business easier and cheaper. This includes the revision to the Investment Act and related regulations to modernise and lend flexibility to our investment framework," the Head of the Fijian Government re-



marked. "Furthermore, the new Act provides investors with a clear vision and the objectives of the Fijian Government and the responsibilities of all parties. For foreign investors to invest in Fiji, they now only need to register with the Registrar of Companies and complete tax registration, which can all be done online." Prime Minister Bainimarama added that the liberalization of our economy has also created opportunities for Government outsourcing and investment opportunities in state-owned enterprises. "Fiji is the first Pacific Island Country that has been invited to be part of the Indo-Pacific Economic Framework that aims to enhance the resilience and competitiveness of its partner countries. My Government has already weighed in on the Ministerial Statement following the exten-

sive technical discussions that have taken place." Fiji hopes to see more regular interaction with the U.S to strengthen trade and investment ties between our people and businesses. At the session, Prime Minister Bainimarama also revealed that the Fiji Trade Commission, based in Burlingame, San Francisco, is fully operational and is available to U.S businesses seeking opportunities in Fiji.

NAKOROKULA YOUTH CLUB GRADUATES WITH AGED-CARE CERTIFICATION

About 40 members of the Nakorokula youth club graduated with Aged-Care Certification conducted by the Fiji National University in partnership with the Ministry of Youth and Sports yesterday (30/09/22). The Minister for Youth and Sports, Parveen Kumar Bala, stated that the conduct of this training resulted from various interactions with members of the community and the Training Needs Analysis which identified the interest amongst youth in undertaking Care Giving Courses because of its potential employment opportunities locally and abroad. "We are reaching out to unreached youths through the provision of Mobile Skills Training to receive some form of certification, develop their skills and gain experiences." "Fijians are well known for aged care support in

many developed countries such as Australia, New Zealand, and the United States of America," said Bala. "The only reason we are identified and recognised in this field is that Fijians are well known for our patience as this type of work requires a lot of endurance," Minister Bala called on these youths to continue to further their training with recognised aged care institutions for employment opportunities, especially under the Pacific Australia Labour Mobility program, which currently has a demand for Fijian workers. The Youth and Sports Minister thanked the Fiji National University as the training facilitator for their continued support towards the development and empowerment of youths through the conduct of such training as a pathway for youth employability.



Fiji News PM BAINIMARAMA ADDRESSES USA CONGRESSIONAL LEADERS AND CALLS FOR SOLIDARITY AND UNDERSTANDING

Bainimarama addressed the Bicameral Bipartisan Members of Congress at Capitol Hill in Washington yesterday (30/09/22), where he stressed that the Pacific looks to the U.S for solidarity and inspiration in tackling some of the gravest challenges the world faces now. Hosted by Speaker Ms Nancy Pelosi, he said that this visit was the largest gathering of leaders from the vast Pacific region in the American capital ever. Prime Minister Bainimarama, in his capacity as the Chair of the Pacific Island Forum, thanked the U.S for hosting the first-ever summit of Pacific Island leaders with President Biden, adding this was an important step up in the right direction. Speaking on the important issue of climate change, he said there is no science-based disagreement that can be made against the urgent need to reduce carbon emissions. "We are grateful for the priority President Biden has

We need the United States to lead—to lead politically and to lead by example," he added. "As you carry forward your effort to build consensus or, lacking consensus, simply the effort to do what must be done by the majority, I want you to know that you have a friend in the South Pacific.

We use all the influence we can wield, and we will proudly work beside you to save this earth." The Prime Minister conveyed his sincere thanks to the representatives and senators who have helped to keep a focus on the Blue Pacific alive in both these houses. "We truly appreciate their efforts and value your solidarity with us while balancing other pressing priorities. "I have a final thought to share. Some of the Pacific Island's countries are barely 30 years old. Fiji's new democracy



is only eight years old. We have a lot to learn from you and your institutions. I would like to encourage far greater and more systematic interaction between parliaments in the Pacific and these two chambers," concluded PM Bainimarama. Speaker, Ms Pelosi thanked Prime Minister Bainimarama for his leadership of the PIF family and said that their visit to Capitol Hill will help to further strengthen solidarity with the Pacific in both houses. She assured the Prime Minister that U.S support for the Pacific cuts across both parties.

PACIFIC SEEKS PARTNERSHIP WITH US IN CLIMATE ACTION

The Pacific's greatest concern is not geopolitics or power politics, it is climate change, pure and simple. This was the strong message delivered by Prime Minister Vorege Bainimarama during the "Discussion on Climate Action, Climate Resilience and Clean Energy Transformation" session at the first-ever US-Pacific Country Summit in Washington D.C. yesterday (30/09/22). The session cochaired by the US President's Special Envoy on Climate, Mr John Kerry, and Special Envoy on Biodiversity, Deputy Secretary Monica Medina brought together Pacific leaders and senior representatives to discuss a shared approach to the climate crisis. "We simply have not been able to engage in good faith with the U.S.A without America taking its rightful place at the helm of the global climate action campaign. Any backward steps now or in the years to come will be a step away from America's place in the Pacific,"

Prime Minister Bainimarama said. "With time running out fast, we need urgency and ambition." Since 2016, the 14 Pacific SIDs have received \$500 million of available climate finance. For this, the Prime Minister said that is zero-point six percent of the global climate finance and a negligible amount compared to the existential climate threat. In his capacity as the Chair of the Pacific Island Forum, Prime Minister Bainimarama requested the Biden Administration to help us meet four priorities which are to meaningfully help us advance the dialogue on Loss and Damage and establish a dedicated funding mechanism to support it. "Also, with your developed country counterparts, deliver on the \$US 100 billion climate finance pledge, and commit to \$750 billion in the post-2025 financing framework, with at least 5% reserved for the Pacific SIDS," he further remarked. Additionally, the Prime Minister

said that "through USAID and your leadership on the GCF and other climate funds, fund, and scale our efforts to link climate action and economic development". "We have miles and miles of seawalls that we need to build, over 40 communities we need to relocate, and a network of national infrastructure to make more climate resilient. With my fellow Pacific leaders, we are trying to decarbonize regional and domestic shipping," he added. "This would protect our oceans and vital fishing ecosystems, revolutionize our infrastructure to fit the 21st century. and transform our regional connectivity. Our recently launched National Climate Finance Strategy includes specific climaterelated projects across every sector of our economy, from human health and gender to agriculture and energy. They all need the technological, technical, and financial expertise that the U.S can provide." "Finally, through the U.S's leadership at



the MDBs, including the IMF, push for structural reforms to the outdated financial frameworks that further punish us for climate events and don't help us finance much-needed climate investments." The Prime Minister said that these reforms include a more holistic assessment of GDP, and the debt-to-GDP ratio, that incorporates a country's climate vulnerabilities, efforts to address the challenge, and climate-related debt. It includes debt-for-nature swaps that help

us invest in ambitious climate adaptation without risking our debt sustainability. At the session, the US Assistant Secretary for Oceans and International Environmental and Scientific Affairs, Ms Monica Medina announced a series of initiatives that the US will be taking to build capacity and this includes improving climate forecasting and also strengthening cooperation in the region and the US institutions, working on oceans and climate change.

Fiji News PRESIDENT BIDEN ADVANCES A FAR-REACHING COOPERATION FRAMEWORK WITH THE BLUE PACIFIC AT THE FIRST-EVER US-PACIFIC SUMMIT

The President of the United States of America, His Excellency, Joseph Biden Jr, has made announcements that have fundamentally transformed U.S and Pacific relations. He launched the first-ever U.S strategy for the Pacific Islands that has at its heart, support for the Pacific's own 2050 Blue Pacific Strategy. He announced the appointment of a special envoy to the Pacific Island Forum to take forward the U.S's enhanced commitments to the region. The U.S President, while delivering his inaugural address at the U.S-Pacific Country Summit in Washington yesterday (30/09/22), announced an increase of USD \$810 million of additional support to take forward these new commitments by the U.S. President Biden said that these far-reaching commitments honour the deep history of the Pacific Islands and the U.S and also promote our longstanding trade and diplomatic relationships. He said the summit is about deepening our enduring commitment to each other and our shared future and our commitment to tackling the climate crisis, which threatens all of us. "We're also committed to working together to equitably rebuild the global economy in the wake of COVID-19 and Russia's war to ensure an Indo-Pacific region that's free and

open, one that is stable and prosperous, and resilient and secure," he said. "A great deal of the history of our world is going to be written in the Indo-Pacific over the coming years, and decades." President Biden said that the Pacific Islands are the critical voice in shaping that future. "That's why my administration has made it a priority to strengthen our partnership with your countries and with the Pacific Islands Forum," he added. The first-ever U.S-Pacific Country Summit also builds on growing high-level engagements with Fiji and the Pacific. This included President Biden's address on the invitation of PIF Chair, Prime Minister Vorege Bainimarama to the Pacific Island Forum last year, making him the first-ever U.S President to address the Pacific Island Forum (PIF). It also included U.S Secretary of State, Mr Antony Blinken's visit to Fiji and then followed by Vice President Kamala Harris's engagement with the recent PIF leaders meeting held in Suva. In taking forward this enhanced engagement with the Pacific, The White House launched the Partners in the Blue Pacific initiative earlier this year. In his response, Prime Minister Vorege Bainimarama said that climate change was the centrepiece of Fiji, Blue Pacific,



and the U.S's enhanced cooperation framework. Further to the announcements by President Biden, he said the U.S has also committed \$130 million in new investments to support climate resilience and build sustainable blue economies in the Pacific Islands; prepare for climate impacts on public health and food security, and to strengthen sustainable development; and to build a better early warning capacity to predict, prepare for, and respond to climate hazards. He said that this is going to build on approximately \$375 million in climate programmes the U.S currently has in the region. "We're also taking several important diplomatic steps and I'm

proud to announce that, following appropriate consultations, we will recognise the Cook Islands and Niue as sovereign states." The U.S President, at the same time, reaffirmed the U.S's commitments to the Pacific in strengthening our ties and working together in certain areas of shared collaboration. Speaking on behalf of the Pacific leaders, Prime Minister Bainimarama said the Blue Pacific met the U.S as an oceanic superpower. "At every level, our people and my Government hope for a direct, broad, and comprehensive partnership with the USA," he said. "Our shared prosperity depends on peace and security across a connected Indo-Pacific and it

depends on securing emissions cuts in line with the 1.5-degree target. America is not there yet. We ask you and the American people for that commitment." At the same time, Prime Minister Bainimarama welcomed the US Pacific Strategy. "We welcome U.S investment, partnerships including with the private sector, and closer maritime security. Most of all, we welcome America back to the Blue Pacific." The Prime Minister thanked the U.S Government for the broadest possible engagement throughout the summit having made much progress on deepening trade, tourism, education, security, and other areas of cooperation.

FIJI AND PIF TO EXPAND MARITIME COOPERATION WITH THE U.S

Leaders of the Pacific and senior representatives attending the US-Pacific Country Summit in Washington D.C were hosted to a dinner at the U.S Coast Guard. The leaders were received by the Commandant of the U.S Coast Guard, Admiral Linda L. Fagan, at the U.S Coast Guard Headquarters. Extensive discussions were held on broadening partnerships with Fiji and the Pacific region, and the U.S in maritime cooperation.

The Chair of the Pacific Islands Forum, Prime Minister Voreqe Bainimarama is hopeful that the region will be further assisted by the U.S Coast Guard in improving surveillance and information sharing between Pacific states. Illegal fishing is a growing problem across the Blue Pacific and leads to annual losses that have grown to several hundred million dollars per year. Small Island States with limited naval and other surveillance capabilities face considerable challenges in managing their large waters and monitoring activities on the high seas, including narcotics and other illicit activities. Prime Minister Bainimarama thanked the United States for its solidarity with the region and welcomed the increased cooperation between the U.S and the Pacific region. Earlier, he commented

FIJI AWARDED ICAO COUNCIL PRESIDENT CERTIFICATE

Fiji was awarded the International Civil Aviation Organisation (ICAO) Council President Certificate in a special ceremony at the 41st Session of the ICAO Assembly. The ICAO Council President Certificate (Certificate) was established in 2015 to support the ICAO's "No Country Left Behind" initiative. This Certificate is awarded to Member States based on results determined through the Universal Safety Oversight Audit Programme (USOAP) to recognise Member States that have made

significant progress in resolving their safety oversight deficiencies and improving the effective implementation (EI) of their safety oversight systems in compliance with ICAO Standard and Recommended Practices (SARPs). The eligibility criteria used for this recognition certificate are based on the results of USOAP Continuous Monitoring Approach (CMA) activities and include: (i) improvement in the EI of the critical elements (CEs) of a State's aviation safety oversight system

above 15 per cent; (ii) meeting the Global Aviation Safety Plan target of at least 75 per cent EI; and (iii) the absence of a Significant Safety Concern. In 2019, following the ICAO In-Country Validation Mission, Fiji improved its EI from 60.55% to 76.3% sitting above the Asia Pacific average of 64.6% and the Global average of 67.5%. The 41st Session of the Assembly of the ICAO will run from the 27th September to 07th October 2022.



NEW ROAD TO RELIEVE BURDEN FOR TIKINA NOEMALU



The burden of carrying farm produce, the sick, and the challenges of crossing the Wainimala river countless times, just to access transportation on the main road will soon be a thing of the past for the people of Tikina Noemalu, in the province of Naitasiri. This, is due to the construction of a new access road by the Fijian Government. During a recent visit to the construction site, Minister for Infrastructure and Meteorological Services, Jone Usamate, said the works that are being carried out are all part of the Government's belief that no one should be left behind. "Government received numerous requests from villagers of Tubarua, Nasauvere and

Matawailevu village to provide a preliminary alignment and concept design for a proposed new access road to their villages," said the Minister. "This new road extends from the existing road at Korovou village, which is the last village connected with the FRA rural road network and will connect three villages upriver and will cover a total of 9.28 kilometres." The Minister, however, said that road construction in hilly terrain is risky and challenging as it deals with proper survey and investigation for alignment, formation, subbase, materials, equipment, subgrade layers, curve decisions, and the need selection of correct equipment, as and when

necessary during construction considering the tangible and intangible aspects to optimise the benefits within the limited availability of resources. Minister Usamate further said that the development work is all part of the Government's commitment to bring accessibility to roads for all the communities around the country. The road will serve approximately 80-100 households and is a major infrastructure development that will aid in transporting produce to the market and provide ease of access to medical and other basic needs. The estimated cost of improvement works is \$284,206.56, with the project scheduled for a duration period of 4 months.

Fiji News FIJI'S PRIME MINISTER AND PACIFIC LEADERS MEET AT U.S STATE DEPARTMENT TO DEEPEN US-PACIFIC RELATIONS

Leaders of the Pacific Island Forum family convened at the U.S Department of State for the opening of the first-ever US-Pacific Island Country Summit in Washington today (29/09/22). Chair of the Pacific Island Forum Prime Minister Vorege Bainimarama, while delivering his address, said this week will be the most significant engagement between the Pacific Islands Forum and the United States in this generation. Prime Minister Bainimarama said that the fact that Pacific leaders will be sharing a room with the U.S President and the entire machinery of the U.S Government tells us how far we have come. Prime Minister was speaking at the People Centred Development in the Pacific event, chaired by the U.S Secretary of State, Mr Antony Blinken. This was the first event to be held in the leadup to the full summit. The event was attended by the Pacific leaders and Heads of the Department of State, Peace Corps, East-West Centre, and the U.S Agency for International Development. Prime Minister Bainimarama said the leaders look forward to working with the United

States to better integrate our economies, improve flows of trade; strengthen our educational links; increase two-way tourism and exchange; link our cultural institutions, and better link our schools and community organisations. The Prime Minister said that Fiji welcomed a people-centred approach to U.S and Pacific relations to broaden engagement and build ties, especially among our young people. Prime Minister Bainimarama urged that more focus on our educational links should be directed to improving the representation of women and girls in science and technology – as this is where we still have a gap. He also emphasised the deepening of sports relations - through coaching programs; sports scholarships for Fijians and more sporting exchanges between our countries. The Prime Minister also spoke about the need to include education as a priority in Fiji and the Pacific. "We need to connect all our schools including primary schools - especially in the furthest islands. Without digital connectivity, we will suffer. Every child needs to be con-



nected to the digital world and we welcome the USA to work with us on the digital education revolution underway in Fiji". "We need to also expand the human resource base in Fiji - especially in advanced marine science; oceanography and other areas needed to drive our Blue economy ambition and we look to the US for partnerships." The Prime Minister said that this historic, first summit demonstrates the most serious and determined effort by the Pacific and the U.S to work together across the Blue Pacific on issues of shared concern. Secretary Blinken, in his address, welcomed the Pacific Leaders and stated that the focus of the U.S in the Pacific will be on empowering the rising generation with knowledge, experiences, and interconnectedness. Secretary Blinken assured Pacific Leaders of a significant expansion of engagement by the U.S in areas such as supporting the development of new skills for the blue economy, cyber security partnership, establishing a larger regional presence of USAID; improving digital access and connectivity, and supporting the empowerment of women and girls. Pacific Leaders in attendance at the summit included the Prime Ministers of Samoa, Tonga, Papua New Guinea, Cook Islands, and the Solomon Islands.

G20 MINISTERS OF TOURISM ENDORSE BALI GUIDELINES

Tuesday, 27 September 2022: Built on strong cooperation and shared responsibility, Tourism Ministers reaffirmed support to rebuild tourism as a more resilient, sustainable, inclusive, and safe sector. The G20 Tourism Ministerial Meeting ('TMM') held in Bali, Indonesia, discussed the future of global tourism under the G20 theme 'recover together, recover stronger' sector. Each Presidency hosts Ministerial meetings on focus areas that further matters of international relevance - building consensus around shared deliverables. Under the 2022 Presidency of Indonesia, a key outcome of the G20 TMM was the endorsement of the G20 Bali Guidelines for Strengthening Communities and Micro, Small and Medium Enterprises as Tourism Transformation Agents: a People-Centered Recovery which asserts a collective stance on

supporting tourism as a transformative sector. Representing Fiji and the Pacific was the Minister for Commerce, Trade, Tourism and Transport, Faiyaz Koya, who shared with the Forum a Small Island Developing States' (SIDS) perspective. "We welcome the five Pillars of the Bali Guidelines. They prioritise our greatest assets – human capital. They strive to enhance innovation and digitalization. It puts women and youth at its heart while calling for stronger governance and investments. Most importantly, it recognises our call to climate action," said Minister Koya. The Guidelines embody a policies and best practices in five main lines of actions including Pillar 1: Human capital: jobs, skills, entrepreneurship and education; Pillar 2: Innovation, digitalization and creative economy; Pillar 3: Women and youth empowerment; Pillar 4: Climate action,

biodiversity conservation and circular economy; and Pillar 5: Policy, governance and investment frameworks. In acknowledging that the G20 members represent over 80 percent of world GDP, 75 percent of international trade and 60 percent of the world population, Hon. Koya added that this makes the G20 a leading forum of change. "The recovery of only 20 countries isn't a recovery at all. Every country that is left out or left behind leaves huge potential on the table for every nation. The strongest possible comeback for the world economy is only ensured by ensuring that all countries are on an equal playing field of opportunity," added Minister Koya. Fiji, on behalf of the Pacific, called on a more permanent observatory role of the Pacific the G20. Along the margins, Fiji held a number of bilateral meetings to further discussions on tourism priorities and strengthen multilateral collaboration with G20 countries. The next G20 TMM is expected to be held under India's Presidency.

10TH OCTOBER INDEPENDENCE DAY FI-JI ISLANDS

Fiji Day is observed on October 10 each year. The Republic of Fiji is a small island nation located in the South Pacific Ocean, 1,100 miles northeast of New Zealand. Known for its archipelago (island groups) that contains hundreds of small islands, Fiji boasts pristine white beaches and a warm, breezy, tropical climate. Fiji Day is the culmination of Fiji Week, a period celebrating the Fijian people's culture, religion, and history. It's a time for happiness and festivities, but it's also a time for introspection and remembrance. Fiji Day is celebrated in Australia, New Zealand, Canada, USA as well UK.

Fiji Day commemorates two key events in the island nation's history, the ceding of Fiji to the United Kingdom in 1874 and Fiji gaining independence in 1970. Although the Dutch explorer Abel Tasman was the first European to explore the archipelago in 1643, the British colonial government took control of Fiji on October 10, 1874. Fiji Day marks the end of Fiji Week, a series of cultural and religious events that celebrate the ethnic diversity of Fijian and Indian people, who inhabit 110 islands in the archipelago.

Fiji Day's main events take place in the town of Levuka, which was the site where the deed of cession was signed. This event began a 96-year process that ended in Fiji finally gaining independence on October 10, 1970. These events honor Fiji's rich history and contribute to local tourism.

Fijians celebrate this nationwide holiday by dressing up in traditional garb and reenacting the events of October 10, 1874. In the capital (Suva), citizens, dignitaries, and local leaders convene in Albert Park to listen to addresses by the President and Prime Minister of Fiji. The park is a historic site named after Prince Albert, consort to Queen Victoria, to whom the country was ceded. Aside from these festivities, Fiji Day also involves military parades, the ceremonial firing of cannons, and the singing of the national anthem. The other communities inhabiting the numerous Fiji islands stage performances paying homage to their cultures.

Ukraine war: Russian troops forced out of eastern town Lyman

Russia has withdrawn its troops from the strategic Ukrainian town of Lyman, in a move seen as a significant setback for its campaign in the east. The retreat came amid fears thousands of soldiers would be encircled in the town. Russia's defence ministry said. Recapturing Lyman could let Ukrainian soldiers reach more contested territory in the Donetsk and Luhansk regions. Ukraine's President Volodymyr Zelenky said on Sunday the town had been "completely cleared" of Russian troops. Video footage shared online on Saturday before the Russian retreat was announced - showed Ukrainian soldiers waving their national flag on the outskirts of the town. Lyman had been used as a logistics hub by Russia, making its recapture all the more signifi-

cant to Ukrainian forces. The battlefield setback prompted the Chechen leader and hardline Moscow ally, Ramzan Kadyrov, to comment that Russia should consider using low-yield nuclear weapons in the face of such defeats. Lyman is in Donetsk one of four partially-occupied Ukrainian regions which Russia declared it was annexing on Friday. Ukraine and its Western allies have dismissed the move as an illegal land-grab.An adviser to Ukraine's defence minister earlier told the BBC that recent gains around Lyman - following days of intense fighting - represented a "considerable success". Russian fighters had been given the chance to surrender, Yurik Sak said, and would face better treatment as prisoners of war than from the Russian military leadership. Shortly af-



terwards, the Kremlin said it was withdrawing its forces from the town, using its Soviet-era name of Krasnyi (Red) Lyman, acknowledging that the Ukrainians had "significant superiority in forces" in the area. Military analysts say that Kyiv currently has momentum in the war, and it has vowed to forge ahead with a counter-offensive to reclaim all territory under occupation. In a speech on Friday, Mr Zelensky said efforts to "liberate our entire land" would act as proof that international law could not be violated.

Brazil election: The presidential race is far from over

When the results came through on Sunday evening, there were cheers for Lula - as well as tears - but the atmosphere felt more like a sense of relief than outright celebration. This wasn't the first-round victory that his supporters had wished for. The polls released a day before the elections had predicted a 14 percentage point gap between Lula and Bolsonaro. They had hoped Lula could avoid a run-off but they vastly underestimated the support for the right-wing leader. "I've never won an election in the first round, it's like destiny wants me to work a bit more," Lula said, trying to reassure people of his chances. "We are going to win the elections again, it's just a question of time." Lula is still the front-runner and his position is still strong. But there is no doubt this has been a blow to the Lula campaign. In the past few weeks, there had been a concerted effort by his supporters to try and encourage wavering voters to choose Lula, to end the Bolsonaro presidency promptly. The show of strength from the right - not

just from Bolsonaro but prominent Bolsonaristas who were also elected to congress and as state governors - has taken people by surprise. "Bolsonarism is much more alive and has a further reach than people had thought and polls had captured," says Esther Solano, a political scientist and Bolsonaro expert. "What we underestimated was the network of regional Bolsonarism. We have to rethink how we are failing to measure the true reach of Bolsonarism in daily life across Brazil." In his post-results speech, Bolsonaro adopted a more humble tone than in the past - a break from his often fiery politics about the left. Perhaps a conscious effort to win over those who are still undecided. "I know there's a desire to change from people but there are certain changes that can be for the worse," he said. "We tried to show that during the campaign but clearly that didn't get through to the most important layers of society." Bolsonaro vowed to show people how to ensure Brazil wouldn't become Venezuela - it's a common comparison



that the far-right makes when criticising the left. In the run-up to this vote, Bolsonaro repeatedly said that the polls were a lie - and to many it looked like he was just a bad loser. But reflecting on Sunday's results, there are people who think that Bolsonaro has a point. It's certainly what Bolsonaro's supporters believe. "It's time for liberty, for justice," says teacher Selma Cardoso who said the polls were biased. If Lula wins she's prepared to take action. "We'll go to the streets saying people are making a mistake. It's time to change - but peacefully." But others who support the president threaten to take a more violent approach. "There's going to be beautiful blood spilled in this city," Alessandro Ferreira Soares, a parachutist, told me if Lula takes the presidency. "I'm prepared to kill all the socialists and communists in the world." It's these ominous threats that make people worried. These next four weeks are going to be intense - and personal. With two powerful political foes now going head-to-head, the campaign steps up several notches. There's everything to play for in this presidential race - and everything to lose if you're on the wrong side. We saw political violence in the run-up to the first round and there's real fear there will be more of that ahead of the run-off.

Iran protests: Supreme leader blames unrest on US and Israel

Iran's supreme leader has blamed the US and Israel for the protests sweeping the country following the death of a woman whilst in police custody. In his first public comments on the unrest, Ayatollah Ali Khamenei said "riots" had been "engineered" by Iran's arch-enemies and their allies. The protests are the biggest challenge to his rule for a decade, and he urged security forces to be ready for more. The US said it was "appalled" by the violent response to the protests. The UK echoed the sentiment, summoning Iran's most senior diplomat in London on Monday, to tell their leaders in Tehran that "instead of blaming external actors for the unrest, they should take responsibility for their actions and listen to the concerns of their people". Mahsa Amini, 22, fell into a coma hours after being detained by morality police on 13 September in Tehran for allegedly breaking the strict law requiring women to cover their hair with a hijab, or headscarf. She died three days later.Her family has alleged that officers beat her head with a baton and banged her head against one of their vehicles. The police have said there is no evidence of any mistreatment and that she suffered "sudden heart failure". Women have led the protests that began after Ms Amini's funeral, waving their headscarves in the air or setting them



on fire to chants of "Woman, life, freedom" and "Death to the dictator" - a reference to Ayatollah Khamenei.Addressing a graduation ceremony of police and armed forces cadets on Monday, the supreme leader said Ms Amini's death "broke our hearts". "But what is not normal is that some people, without proof or an investigation, have made the streets dangerous, burned the Quran, removed hijabs from veiled women and set fire to mosques and cars," he added, without mentioning any specific incidents. The ayatollah, who has the final say on all state matters, asserted that foreign powers had planned "rioting" because they could not tolerate Iran "attaining strength in all spheres". "I say clearly that these riots and the insecurity were engineered by America and the occupying, false Zionist regime [Israel], as well as their paid agents, with the help of some traitorous Iranians abroad." He also gave his full backing to the security forces, saying that they had faced "injustice" during the unrest. Iran Human Rights, a Norwaybased group, said on Sunday that at least 133 people had

been killed by security forces so far. They include 41 protesters whom ethnic Baluch activists said had died in clashes in Zahedan on Friday. State media have reported that more than 40 people have been killed, including security personnel.Ayatollah Khamenei's comments came a day after security forces violently cracked down on a protest by students at Iran's most prestigious science and engineering university, reportedly arresting dozens. The BBC's Kasra Naji says the gunfire heard around the campus of Sharif University of Technology in Tehran on Sunday night spread fear among many Iranians that authorities had decided to make an example of the students. Security forces tried to the enter the campus, but the students drove them back and closed all the entrance gates. But, our correspondent adds, a siege developed and the students who tried to leave through an adjacent car park were picked up one by one and beaten, blindfolded and taken away. In one video posted on social media, a large number of people are seen running inside a car park while being pursued by men on motorbikes.

Gold coins hidden in 7th Century found in wall

Archaeologists in Israel say 44 pure gold coins dating to the 7th Century have been found hidden in a wall at a nature reserve. Weighing about 170g, the hoard found at the Hermon Stream (Banias) site was hidden during the Muslim conquest of the area in 635, experts estimated. They said the coins shed light on the end of the Byzantine rule in the area. The Byzantine Empire was the eastern half of the Roman Empire, which survived for more than 1,000 years. "We can imagine the owner concealing his fortune in the threat of war, hoping to return one day to retrieve his property," said Yoav Lerer, director of the excavation. "In retrospect, we know that he was less fortunate."Apart from the gold coins, the excavation - in a residential quarter of the ancient city - also uncovered the remains of buildings, water channels and pipes, bronze coins and much more, Israeli authorities said. Dr Gabriela Bijovsky, a numismatic (currency) expert at the Israel Antiquities Authority, said some of the coins were of Emperor Phocas (602-610), but most were of his successor Heraclius. Banias has a particular place in Christian tradition, being the site where Jesus is said to have told the apostle Peter, "on this rock, I will build my church".
